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Explanations

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1. What is the maximum layer thickness when using FDP?

When performing a full-depth patch, each lift of patch material should be placed no thicker than three inches. This limit ensures the asphalt can be compacted properly with standard rollers and equipment, creating a dense, well-bonded repair that matches the surrounding pavement. If more depth is needed, the patch is built up in successive lifts, each limited to three inches and typically reinforced with a tack coat between lifts to promote adhesion. Thicker lifts are hard to compact adequately, which can leave air voids, weak joints, and settlement problems, making the patch prone to cracking and failure. Therefore, the maximum layer thickness is three inches.

Net weight of mix is the actual quantity of asphalt blend produced for the day. It's the value operators use to track daily production, verify compliance with the mix design, and support payment and quality-control records. The other terms describe a batch that was rejected, weather-related restrictions, or a copy of the batching ticket, none of which define the daily produced quantity.

Those effects—the improved adhesion between layers and moisture protection—are exactly what surface prep priming is meant to provide, making this option the best fit. The other ideas describe changes to the asphalt itself, a cosmetic finish, or drainage improvements, none of which are the primary role of surface prep priming.

Rapid drying of the coating is essential for bonding between layers. When solvent is highly volatile, it evaporates quickly, thinning the asphalt for easy application and then leaving a thin, tacky film that provides a good bond without remaining wet. This rapid evaporation is exactly what you want in tack coats and surface treatments, which are applied as bonding or seal layers between the existing pavement and the new course. Dust control and paving don't rely on a fast-evaporating solvent in the same way—the former uses binding agents to control dust, and the latter uses hot mix asphalt without a rapid-evaporation solvent action.

In asphalt paving, a control strip is used to determine how the mat should be finished. After the breakdown and intermediate passes, you look at the 400–500 ft segment to see how well the mat has compacted and whether the surface and density meet targets. The finish roller's number of passes is then set based on what you observe in that strip. This approach ties the final compaction directly to in-field results rather than following a fixed routine, helping ensure the pavement finishes correctly. That's why using the results of the breakdown and intermediate passes to decide how many finish passes are needed is the best description. Skipping the step would risk improper compaction, and applying a uniform 3-3-3 pattern or increasing passes without regard to the strip doesn't reflect the actual conditions and needs.

Workability is the aspect that describes how easy the hot mix asphalt is to mix, place, and compact. A workable mix flows and fills the space under rollers at the correct temperature, allowing efficient production and a dense, uniform pavement once compacted. This quality depends on binder viscosity at paving temperature, the structure and gradation of the aggregates, moisture, and the overall temperature and air voids in the mix. If the mix is too stiff, it won't pump, spread, or compact properly, leading to placement difficulties and poor compaction. If it's too soft, it can smear, track, or move too much under roller pressure. In contrast, stability measures resistance to deformation under load after compaction, impermeability refers to preventing water penetration, and durability concerns long-term performance.

Traction on a pavement surface comes from friction between tires and the roadway, and the term used to describe how well asphalt mixes maintain that friction is skid resistance. In HMA, surface texture—driven by the aggregate's shape, size distribution, and hardness—and the condition of the asphalt film work together to provide grip, especially in wet conditions where adequate texture helps shed water and maintain contact. Skid resistance is what engineers monitor to gauge how safely the surface will perform during braking and cornering. The other terms refer to materials or production steps rather than the pavement's ability to grip, so they don't describe this functional trait.
