Indifference reflects a lack of interest or concern, but it does not necessarily imply an active desire for change. Concern indicates awareness and caution, which can coexist with complacency. Satisfaction suggests a fulfillment that is quite akin to complacency rather than its opposite.

In essence, "belabor" encapsulates the idea of lengthy criticism more fully than the other terms, making it the most suitable choice.

"Adjust" implies modification rather than direct alignment. "Coordinate" suggests organizing different activities or people but doesn't imply they are necessarily in harmony. "Synchronize" relates to timing and making things operate simultaneously, rather than ensuring their underlying approaches are fundamentally in sync. Therefore, "align" is the term that closely encapsulates the essence of "attune" in the context here.
