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Explanations

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1. Which term is the act of confirming receipt of a message?

Feedback is the response that confirms a message was received and understood. In communication, it's the information the sender gets back from the receiver, showing whether the message arrived and what impression it left. When someone says they received the message or notes it, that reply signals the loop is closed and helps ensure clarity moving forward. The other terms don't fit because Kardex is about record-keeping, icons are symbols used in interfaces, and goals are targets to achieve—none describe confirming that a message has been received.

Magnetic resonance imaging is what MRI stands for. Because it doesn't rely on ionizing radiation, MRI is often preferred for evaluating delicate structures where radiation exposure should be avoided. In contrast, X-ray imaging and computed tomography rely on X-rays, which are forms of ionizing radiation, and positron emission tomography uses radioactive tracers to show metabolic activity rather than detailed anatomy. So, the term MRI specifically represents Magnetic Resonance Imaging.

Pictures that represent actions in a computer or mobile interface are called icons. Icons are graphical symbols that stand for functions like saving, deleting, or searching, giving quick recognition and enabling users to access actions without reading text. The other terms describe different ideas—assessment is evaluation, feedback is information about performance, and social relates to interaction with others—none of which refer to pictures that stand for functions.

This approach directly fits the idea of a team suggesting options for solving a problem because it centers on collaborative idea generation rather than criticizing ideas or focusing on unrelated concepts. The other terms described describe actions or concepts that aren't about generating solution options: reassuring clichés are comforting phrases, gestures are nonverbal actions, and cultural diversity refers to the mix of backgrounds in a team.

Distinguishing features or qualities are called traits. The other terms don't fit the idea of describing distinctive features: goals refer to desired ends, infection is a disease-causing condition, and observation is the act of noticing something. So traits is the best fit.

Bar coding is the method used. By placing barcodes on supplies and on patient identifiers, staff scan items at the point of use and at receipt. Each scan updates real-time records that tie the exact quantity used to the patient's bill and to current inventory levels. This automates charge capture and stock management, reduces manual data entry and errors, and helps ensure accurate billing. The other options don't fit this purpose: a central processing unit is a computer component rather than a system for tracking inventory and charges; a graphic sheet isn't a recognized method for managing supplies or linking them to patient accounts; and passwords relate to security access, not inventory control or patient billing.

The idea being tested is an approach that keeps getting better over time by focusing on quality and what customers need. Total quality management treats quality as everyone's job and aims to prevent defects by continually refining processes. It centers on listening to customers, using data to guide decisions, and making small, ongoing improvements across all parts of the organization. By planning changes, testing them, checking results, and acting on what's learned, you reduce variation, improve production quality, and boost customer satisfaction. That broader, systemic focus is what sets it apart from the other terms. Negotiation is about bargaining between parties and doesn't inherently drive quality improvement across the whole organization. Harassment is inappropriate behavior and not a framework for improving products or services. Team refers to a group working together, which can exist within many approaches but doesn't by itself describe the comprehensive, ongoing quality-management process focused on customer satisfaction.

Typing information means entering text into the computer, and the keyboard is the device built for that task. It's an input tool that lets you input letters, numbers, and symbols by pressing keys, sending those characters to the computer to be processed. The mouse is for pointing and selecting, the monitor displays what's happening, and the speaker outputs sound. Because entering text is precisely what the keyboard is designed to do, it's the best answer.

9. What term best describes a group working together toward a common goal?

Working together toward a common goal describes teamwork, and a team is a group that shares a purpose, communicates, and coordinates to achieve objectives. A team brings together diverse skills and supports one another to complete tasks more effectively than individuals working alone. A leader is one person who guides the group, not the group itself. Tools like flow charts, fishbone diagrams, and storyboards are planning and visualization methods, not a term for a group. Honor is a value or recognition, not a description of how people collaborate. Because the question asks for the term for the group that collaborates toward a shared objective, the best choice is team.

Observation is the practice of noting and recording facts using the senses. For example, you might observe that a machine is overheating, a panel light is red, or a sound is unusual, and then report those observable facts. Icons are visual symbols representing ideas, not the act of sensing and recording facts. A Kardex is a filing system for organizing information, not about using the senses to gather data. Traits refer to characteristics or attributes of a person or thing, not the process of noticing and reporting what you perceive. So, the term that best fits the described practice is observation.
