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Explanations

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1. The child first forms a concept of self in which stage?

The main idea here is when a child first starts to form a sense of self. In infancy, babies begin to develop basic self-awareness by noticing their own bodies, differentiating themselves from others, and understanding that their actions have effects on the world around them. And it doesn't replace reading instruction; instead, music often supports literacy development through songs, rhymes, and chants that build phonemic awareness and language skills.
