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Explanations

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1. INOP stands for which term?

- A. Inactive
- B. Initial Operating Experience
- C. Irregular Operations Report
- D. Inoperative**

INOP is used in aviation to label equipment that is not functioning and cannot be used until it's repaired or otherwise brought back to service. That makes Inoperative the correct term. The other options don't fit because they refer to different ideas: Inactive suggests something not currently in use but potentially usable again, Initial Operating Experience is a training term, and Irregular Operations Report is a separate type of operational report.

2. Nevada is in which time zone?

- A. Mountain Time Zone
- B. Central Time Zone
- C. Pacific Time Zone**
- D. Eastern Time Zone

Time zones follow the longitudinal location of a state, and Nevada sits in the Pacific Time Zone. That means it uses Pacific Standard Time in the winter and Pacific Daylight Time in the summer, the same as California and most of the U.S. West Coast. The other zones are farther east, which would place clocks a different amount of time ahead, so they don't fit Nevada's geographic position.

3. What does SSI stand for?

- A. Sensitive Security Information**
- B. Security Sensitive Information
- C. Sensitive Security Data
- D. Security and Safety Information

SSI stands for Sensitive Security Information. This designation is used in aviation security to mark unclassified information that, if disclosed, could compromise transportation security. It covers details like security vulnerabilities, specific security procedures, and security plans. Because of its sensitive nature, SSI is restricted in how it's handled and shared. The other options don't match the official term used in this context: Security Sensitive Information, Sensitive Security Data, and Security and Safety Information are not the recognized designations.

4. Which state is listed as entirely in the Central Time Zone?

- A. Illinois

Central Time runs across a broad middle portion of the country, and some states fall completely within it while others cross into neighboring zones. Illinois lies entirely in the Central Time Zone, so every part of the state follows Central Time. Nebraska and South Dakota have western regions that use Mountain Time, not Central, so they aren't entirely in Central. Arizona is in Mountain Time, not Central. Because of these zone boundaries, Illinois is the state listed that is entirely in the Central Time Zone.

5. Colorado observes which time zone?

- A. Pacific Time Zone
- B. Central Time Zone

- D. Mountain Time Zone

Colorado sits in the Mountain Time Zone. That means its standard time is Mountain Standard Time (MST, UTC-7), and in daylight saving time it switches to Mountain Daylight Time (MDT, UTC-6). The other zones are nearby but not where Colorado is located: Pacific Time is one hour behind Mountain, Central Time is one hour ahead, and Eastern Time is two hours ahead. So Colorado isn't in Pacific, Central, or Eastern Time.

6. Which term describes a schedule indicating reserve availability periods, assignments, and days off?

- A. Remain Overnight (RON) - aircraft
- B. Preflight Inspection
- C. Tail Wind

This question tests knowledge of airline crew scheduling terms. A reserve line is the schedule that shows when a crew member must be available as a reserve, the assignments they may receive if called, and the days off. It sets up on-call blocks so a crew can be tapped to cover gaps without having a fixed trip every day. When not on reserve, a crew member would have a regular line, while the reserve line provides flexibility for last minute needs. The other terms don't describe a crew schedule: Remain Overnight refers to an aircraft staying somewhere overnight, Preflight Inspection is the safety check done before a flight, and Tail Wind describes wind direction and speed relative to the flight path.

7. PSU stands for which term?

PSU stands for Passenger Service Unit, the panel above each passenger that provides the personal air vent, reading light, and the call button to summon a flight attendant. This is the standard term used in airline cabin design and safety documentation, so it's the correct expansion. The other phrases aren't recognized cabin terminology, so they don't fit the established nomenclature. Remembering this helps you interpret cabin diagrams and manuals where PSU is labeled.

8. What does LSK stand for?

- A. Lavatory Supply Kit
- B. Main Cabin Door
- C. Manual Deploy Tool
- D. Protective Breathing Equipment

In aviation cabin terminology, LSK refers to the Lavatory Supply Kit—the kit crews use to replenish items in the lavatories, such as soap, towels, toilet paper, liners, and waste bags, during service or after cleaning. It's a stocked kit, not a door, tool, or safety equipment. The other options describe different items or components (a cabin door, a tool for deployment, or breathing equipment), which are unrelated to stocking the lavatory. Knowing this abbreviation helps you quickly identify the purpose of the kit when preparing or maintaining the cabin.

9. Which of the following states is in the Mountain Time Zone?

- A. Utah
- B. Nevada
- C. Oregon
- D. Washington

Time zones run roughly east west across the United States, with the Mountain Time Zone sitting to the east of the Pacific Zone and to the west of the Central Zone. Utah lies in that Mountain band, using Mountain Standard Time in the winter and Mountain Daylight Time in the summer. Nevada, Oregon, and Washington are all in the Pacific Time Zone, one hour behind Mountain Time. So Utah is the state in the Mountain Time Zone.

10. CRM stands for which of the following?

- A. Crew Response Management
- B. Cargo Resource Management
- C. Crew Regulation Manual
- D. Crew Resource Management**

CRM is the standard term for how a flight crew uses all available resources—people, aircraft systems, equipment, and information—to maintain safety and efficiency. It emphasizes clear communication, teamwork, decision making, and workload management in the cockpit and beyond. This focus on coordinating resources is why the option that uses "Resource" is the correct choice. The other phrases don't describe the recognized aviation training concept.
