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Explanations

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1. Which of the following is best for comparing several categories at a single point in time?

- A. Line graph
- B. Bar chart**
- C. Pie chart
- D. Scatter plot

Bar charts are ideal for comparing several categories at a single point in time because each category has its own bar whose length represents its value, making differences across categories easy to see at a glance. The bars line up side by side, so you can quickly judge which categories are higher or lower without tracking along a time axis or parsing proportions. This snapshot view is exactly what you need when the goal is to compare categories at one moment. In contrast, a line graph focuses on how values change over time, not a one-shot comparison across many categories; a pie chart shows parts of a whole and can become hard to read when there are many categories or similar values; a scatter plot reveals relationships between two numeric variables rather than a simple side-by-side category comparison. If you ever need to compare multiple measures per category, you can use grouped bars, but for a straightforward single-time comparison across categories, the bar chart is the clearest choice.

2. Life is short, art endures is the theme of which college?

This question is about recognizing which college has a specific theme or motto that guides its identity. The phrase "Life is short, art endures" is the theme associated with Porter College, reflecting a focus on the arts and the idea that creativity endures beyond everyday bustle. Because the motto exactly matches Porter College's stated theme, it's the best fit for this question. The other colleges have different guiding themes, so their mottos do not align with this line.

3. What lab located in Science Hill researches planets inside and outside the solar system, and runs the Exoplanet Summer Program?

- A. Other Worlds Laboratory**
- B. Lick Observatory
- C. SlugCents
- D. Cruz Care

This question tests recognizing a lab whose name and programs point to exoplanet work. The Other Worlds Laboratory name clearly suggests studying planets beyond Earth, and its involvement with researching planets inside and outside the solar system fits perfectly with exoplanet exploration. It also runs the Exoplanet Summer Program, which directly confirms its focus on exoplanets. The other names don't align with this exoplanet emphasis or with a program about exoplanets in this setting, so they don't fit as well.

4. In evaluating an argument, which evidence most strengthens a claim about cause and effect?

A. Anecdotal reports

B. Well-controlled experimental/longitudinal data showing consistent results

C. Experiments with small samples

D. Historical correlational data

When evaluating a cause-and-effect claim, the strongest evidence comes from well-controlled experiments or longitudinal studies that produce consistent results. Such evidence helps establish three key things: temporal order (the cause comes before the effect), covariation (the two move together), and rule out alternative explanations (confounding factors are minimized). Well-controlled experiments use random assignment and comparison groups to isolate the effect of the variable of interest, so differences can be attributed to the cause rather than to other factors. Longitudinal data follow the same subjects over time, showing that the proposed cause precedes the outcome and that the relationship holds across time and contexts. When results are consistent across multiple well-designed studies, the confidence in a causal claim grows. Anecdotal reports lack systematic measurement and are prone to bias. Small-sample studies have limited power and may not generalize. Historical correlational data show associations but cannot tell which comes first or whether a third variable explains the link.

5. In the sequence 3, 9, 27, 81, 243, what is the common ratio?

A. 2

B. 9

C. 3

D. 6

In a geometric sequence, the same factor multiplies each term to get the next one. Here, each term is three times the previous one: $3 \times 3 = 9$, $9 \times 3 = 27$, $27 \times 3 = 81$, $81 \times 3 = 243$. So the constant multiplier is 3. The other options wouldn't reproduce the progression consistently—for example, multiplying by 2 would yield 6 after the first step, not 9; multiplying by 9 would jump from 3 to 27, skipping 9; multiplying by 6 would give 18, not 9.

6. How many music groups are on campus?

A. 12

B. 19

C. 24

D. 7

This question tests your ability to extract and count items from a data source, like a campus clubs directory. To answer, locate the listing of music groups on campus and count every distinct group once, making sure not to double-count or include non-music clubs. In this case, the directory shows nineteen unique music groups, so nineteen is the correct total. If you got a different number, re-check the list for duplicates or entries that aren't actually music groups.

7. Where can students go for 1-on-1 financial counseling services?

- A. SlugCents**

- D. Lick Observatory

You're being asked to identify where students can get personalized, one-on-one financial guidance. SlugCents is the campus service dedicated to financial counseling, offering individual sessions to help with budgeting, loan repayment, and overall financial planning tailored to a student's situation. The other options don't fit because Cruz Care focuses on health services, Merrill College is a residential/academic unit, and Lick Observatory is an astronomy facility; none provides one-on-one financial counseling. So SlugCents is the right place for this kind of help.

8. If the relationship between temperature and ice-cream sales is linear with a slope of 7 units per degree, what is the change in sales when the temperature increases by 3 degrees?

- A. 7 units
- B. 21 units**
- C. 14 units
- D. 24 units

In a linear relationship, the slope tells you how much the sales change for each degree of temperature. A slope of 7 means sales rise by 7 units for every 1-degree increase. If the temperature goes up by 3 degrees, the total change in sales is $7 \times 3 = 21$ units. So the sales increase by 21 units.

9. What is term 6 of the sequence that starts at 1 and follows the pattern add5, multiply by2, add3, multiply by2?

- A. 28
- B. 30
- C. 35**
- D. 40

Following a repeating sequence of operations on a starting number: add 5, then multiply by 2, then add 3, then multiply by 2, and repeat. Start with 1 as the first term and apply the steps in order: 1 add 5 6 multiply by 2 12 add 3 15 multiply by 2 30 Continuing the cycle, the next operation is add 5: 30 add 5 35 So the sixth term is 35.

10. Which of the following is NOT a service offered to EOP students?

- A. Free Printing
- B. Textbook Access Program
- C. Undocumented Student Services
- D. Campus Internship Service**

EOP programs are built to support students' academic success and access to essential resources, addressing barriers that can affect persistence and performance. Free printing is a practical cost relief that helps students complete assignments without worrying about budget, so it fits naturally as an EOP offering. The Textbook Access Program directly supports learning by providing required materials, which aligns with academic success goals. Undocumented Student Services often exist within EOP or collaborate closely with it to ensure inclusive support and navigation help for students facing additional hurdles. A Campus Internship Service, while valuable for career development, is typically a separate Career Services function focused on internship placement, resumes, and employer connections, not a core EOP benefit. That separation is why Campus Internship Service is not considered an EOP offering.
