1. What are markings found on the head of ammunition that indicate the caliber or gauge and identify the manufacturer?

Headstamps are the markings on the base of a cartridge case that tell you its caliber or gauge and who manufactured it. These marks are pressed into the head during production and may also include country of origin, year, or lot information. This marking system is how forensic examiners and shooters identify the ammunition's source and specification. The other parts mentioned—the powder (propellant), the primer (ignites the powder), and the bullet (the projectile)—are components, not identification marks placed on the base.

2. Which term describes groups that originate within the prison system?

Understanding origin of security threat groups in correctional settings. STG stands for Security Threat Group, and when a group is described as Prison Based, the key idea is that it originated inside the prison system itself—formed by inmates within the facility and operating there. These groups emerge from the prison environment, often to handle protection, control internal dynamics, or run illicit activities. Traditional STGs, in contrast, have roots outside the prison, in the broader community, and arrive behind bars with those preexisting affiliations. Non-traditional STGs refer to groups that form in the prison but aren't tied to established street gangs, while extremist STGs are organized around extremist ideologies. The term that best describes groups that originate within the prison system is Prison Based STGs.

Passive resistance is non-compliant behavior where the subject refuses to follow a lawful direction and does not actively attack or flee, yet their lack of cooperation prevents the officer from gaining control with simple commands. The key is that the refusal to comply prompts the officer to use physical techniques to establish control. This distinguishes it from mere voluntary compliance (no resistance), attempting to flee without resistance (not resisting), or simply failing to answer questions (not about complying with directions). The essence is non-violent refusal to cooperate that necessitates escalation to physically establish control.

Criminal Act describes a violation of the law. In Florida, crimes are designated as felonies or misdemeanors under s. 775.08(4), F.S., which centers on the act that breaks the law. Counseling is guidance, Courtesy is polite behavior, and Criminal Justice refers to the system that enforces and administers the law. So the term that captures the idea of a legal violation is Criminal Act.

Stalling is a tactic focused on safety by delaying action in order to maintain control of the situation while you recover, reassess, or wait for backup. In tense encounters, you don't rush to intervene with force; you establish a controlled position, use your stance and positioning to limit the suspect's movements, and employ calm commands to keep the scene stable. This pause buys you time to evaluate threats, reorient yourself, and coordinate with others, reducing the risk of a sudden, dangerous escalation until more help arrives. Stance is just how you stand and doesn't describe a deliberate delay or control tactic. Skeletal system is unrelated anatomy. Squid Load isn't a recognized tactical term.

6. Which term means any modification or adjustment that will allow a qualified inmate with a disability to participate in the programs, services, or activities of an institution or facility?

The central idea is ensuring equal access by making modifications that remove barriers for a qualified inmate with a disability so they can participate in programs, services, or activities. This term—Reasonable Accommodation—refers to specific adjustments or changes to policies, practices, or procedures that enable participation while preserving the program’s integrity and security. The accommodation must be feasible and not place an undue burden on the facility or fundamentally alter how the program operates. In a correctional setting, this means evaluating what adjustments are needed—such as adapting facilities, providing assistive devices, or modifying scheduling—to allow meaningful participation without compromising safety. Other phrases like Reasonable Adjustment, Accessible Programming, or Inclusive Policy describe related ideas but are not the standard term used to define the concrete modifications that make participation possible under disability rights law.

Security Threat Group refers to an organized criminal network that poses safety or security threats both inside a correctional facility and in the community. Inside a facility, STGs can drive violence, traffic in contraband, and exert control over inmates, while outside they continue illegal activities and maintain influence that can spill back into the institution. This dual, ongoing threat is why the term fits the question—the label captures a persistent criminal enterprise that endangers people and operations in both settings. A seizure is simply taking control of something, a riot is a violent disturbance during a specific incident, and a report is just a written record, none of which describe an organized group with impact inside and outside.

8. Which term refers to the skeletal framework that supports the body, protects vital organs, and enables mobility?

Think about what holds you upright and lets you move. The skeleton is the body's framework, providing shape and support so you can stand and carry weight. It also protects essential organs—your skull shields the brain, and the ribcage safeguards the heart and lungs. When you move, bones and joints act as levers that muscles pull on, enabling mobility. Skin covers and protects the body but isn't the framework you're describing. Shrimping and squid load are unrelated terms here. So the term that best fits the description is the skeletal system.

Situational awareness is about noticing and understanding what's happening around you, and predicting how things may change in the near future. It involves observing people, movements, sounds, and environmental cues, then interpreting how those cues affect safety and what actions might be needed. In corrections, this awareness helps you spot potential threats, locate exits, anticipate changes in a scene, and coordinate effectively with others. The other terms aren't about watching your surroundings: slang is informal language, squelch means to suppress or quiet something, and a spiral search pattern is a method for systematically searching an area, not the act of paying attention to what's around you.

10. Which system connects to the spinal cord and branches out to every part of the body, serving as two-way communication?

- A. Central nervous system
- B. Endocrine system

Signals traveling between the brain or spinal cord and the rest of the body travel through the peripheral nervous system. This network of nerves branches out from the spinal cord and brain to reach every part of the body, enabling two-way communication: sensory information from the body to the CNS and motor commands from the CNS to muscles and organs. The central nervous system itself is the brain and spinal cord and doesn't extend to every tissue, while the endocrine system uses hormones rather than neural signals. The autonomic nervous system is a part of the peripheral system that controls automatic functions, but the overall description of branching to every part of the body and supporting two-way neural communication fits the peripheral nervous system.
