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Explanations

This helps avoid clutter and distortion that can come with trying to fit everything onto a single, flat representation. In contrast, Iceland, Greenland, and Malta are typically included on standard world maps because they're more readily placed within the common view of the world and serve as recognizable reference points, even if small. Greenland's enormous size makes it hard to ignore, Malta sits in a well-known European region, and Iceland lies in a conspicuous position in the North Atlantic.

Punt is famously described in Egyptian records as a source of luxury materials that Egypt couldn't easily obtain on its own. This combination—gold with spices (in the sense of resinous aromatics like myrrh and frankincense)—fits Punt's role as a supplier of luxury goods for Egyptian demand. The other options don't align with Punt's well-documented trade image. Wine and olives are typical of Mediterranean regions rather than Punt; copper and tin point to different mining areas; glass and beads are manufactured goods more commonly tied to other trade networks.

While she did achieve a historic solo flight across the Atlantic, that milestone sits within her broader legacy and isn't the defining moment people most remember. She didn't invent the airplane, and she did not successfully complete a solo circumnavigation, which is why the description focusing on the daring around-the-world attempt best captures what she is most known for.

In contrast, the spleen, liver, and gallbladder have more clearly defined jobs: the spleen filters blood and supports immune responses, the liver carries out numerous metabolic tasks including bile production, and the gallbladder stores and concentrates bile.

That Bolivian setting is what ties Puma Punku to its place in world archaeology, rather than to Peru (home of sites like Machu Picchu), Mexico (with sites such as Teotihuacan), or Argentina.

Dark matter is the non-luminous material that has mass and produces gravity, yet does not emit, absorb, or reflect light. We detect its presence because galaxies rotate faster than they should if only visible matter were present, galaxy clusters hold together with more mass than we can see, and patterns in the cosmic microwave background and gravitational lensing require extra unseen mass. This is why we call it dark—its light is invisible, not because it isn't there. It differs from ordinary matter, which you can see as stars and gas, and from antimatter, which would annihilate when it meets regular matter. Dark energy is a separate, pervasive influence driving the universe's accelerated expansion, not the mass that clumps in galaxies.
