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Explanations

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1. Which pair correctly lists the IATA and ICAO codes for Los Angeles International?

- A. IATA LAX; ICAO KLAX
- B. IATA ORD; ICAO KORD
- C. IATA LAX; ICAO KJFK**
- D. IATA SFO; ICAO KSFO

IATA codes are the three-letter identifiers most travelers see, used on tickets and baggage tags, while ICAO codes are four-letter identifiers used for flight operations and air traffic control. In the United States, ICAO codes typically start with a "K" followed by the IATA code. For Los Angeles International, the IATA code is LAX and the ICAO code is KLAX. So the correct pairing is LAX for IATA and KLAX for ICAO. (For contrast, JFK is KJFK for ICAO, ORD is KORD, and SFO is KSFO—these refer to other airports.)

2. Which city is served by code FLL?

FLL is an IATA airport code assigned to Fort Lauderdale–Hollywood International Airport. This three-letter code identifies the airport that serves the city of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, so the city associated with FLL is Fort Lauderdale. For context, ECP, LEX, and JAN correspond to Panama City, Kentucky, and Jackson, Mississippi airports, respectively.

3. What is the IATA code for Munich?

- A. MUC**

IATA airport codes are the three-letter identifiers used worldwide to label airports on tickets, luggage tags, and manifests. For Munich, the official IATA code is MUC, which is why this is the correct choice—the code uniquely identifies Munich Airport in the IATA system. The other codes point to different airports (for example, MXP is Milan Malpensa) and do not represent Munich, so they wouldn't correctly identify Munich's airport.

4. Kahului (Maui) is represented by which airport code?

Airport codes are three-letter identifiers used for airports. Kahului Airport on Maui is assigned the IATA code OGG. The other codes point to different cities: HNL is Honolulu, SAN is San Diego, and PDX is Portland. So the code that represents Kahului (Maui) is OGG.

5. Which airport code corresponds to West Palm Beach, Florida?

Identifying the airport code for a city means matching the three-letter IATA code to the airport that serves that location. For West Palm Beach, Florida, the primary airport is Palm Beach International Airport, and its IATA code is PBI. This code is the shorthand used on tickets, boarding passes, and baggage tags to route travelers correctly. The other codes correspond to different cities: MCO is Orlando International, SRQ is Sarasota, and TLH is Tallahassee. So PBI is the code that represents West Palm Beach.

6. What are the IATA and ICAO codes for Montreal-Pierre Elliott Trudeau International?

Understanding how airport codes work helps here. IATA codes are the 3-letter codes used by travelers and on tickets, while ICAO codes are 4-letter identifiers used by air traffic control and flight operations. In Canada, ICAO codes start with a C, followed by additional letters that often resemble the IATA code. Montreal-Pierre Elliott Trudeau International uses the IATA code YUL and the ICAO code CYUL. That pairing specifically identifies this airport. The other options point to different airports: YVR/CYVR is Vancouver, YYZ/CYYZ is Toronto Pearson, and SFO/KSFO is San Francisco.

7. UVF corresponds to which location?

- A. Nassau, Bahamas

IATA airport codes are three-letter identifiers that map to specific airports worldwide. UVF identifies Hewanorra International Airport, which serves Saint Lucia and is located near Vieux-Fort in the island's southern region. The other options point to different airports: Nassau's international airport uses NAS, Kingston's Norman Manley International uses KIN, and Lagos's Murtala Muhammed International uses LOS. So UVF corresponds to Vieux-Fort, Saint Lucia.

8. LEX corresponds to which city?

- A. Panama City, Florida
- B. Lexington, Kentucky**
- C. Key West, Florida
- D. Jacksonville, Florida

Three-letter IATA airport codes are usually tied to the city or the airport name. LEX is derived from Lexington and is the code assigned to Blue Grass Airport serving Lexington, Kentucky. That's why LEX corresponds to Lexington, Kentucky. For contrast, Panama City, Florida uses a different code, Key West has its own code, and Jacksonville, Florida uses another distinct code, so those cities aren't represented by LEX.

9. What is the ICAO code for Rome Fiumicino?

- A. LIRF**
- B. LIRP

- D. LIRE

ICAO airport codes are four-letter designators used for flight planning and air traffic control. For Italy, codes begin with LI, signaling the country in Europe, and the last two letters identify the specific airport. Rome Fiumicino's official code is LIRF, with the RF portion assigned to that airport. That makes it the correct designation for Rome Fiumicino. The other options point to different Italian airports, so they don't represent Rome Fiumicino.

10. Which city corresponds to the IATA code PVD?

- A. Norfolk Virginia USA
- B. Portland Maine USA
- C. Chicago Midway Illinois USA
- D. Providence Rhode Island USA**

IATA airport codes are three-letter identifiers used for quick reference to airports, often tied to the city or airport name. PVD is the code assigned to Providence, Rhode Island. It specifically designates the Theodore Francis Green Memorial State Airport serving Providence, located near Warwick, RI. That's why PVD is linked with Providence. The other options correspond to different cities: Norfolk, Virginia uses ORF, Portland, Maine uses PWM, and Chicago Midway in Illinois uses MDW. So those codes don't match PVD. If you see PVD, think Providence, Rhode Island.
