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Explanations

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1. Which item uses PLU code 4061?

- A. Lettuce (4061)**
- B. Cilantro (4899)**
- C. Peach (4044)**
- D. Kiwi (4030)**

PLU codes are four-digit identifiers assigned to specific produce items so cashiers can ring them up with the correct price. The code 4061 is designated for lettuce, so the item that uses this PLU is lettuce. The other items have different PLU numbers—cilantro with 4899, peach with 4044, and kiwi with 4030—so they don't match 4061. For context, organic versions often use five-digit PLUs starting with 9, but the four-digit 4061 here identifies conventional lettuce.

2. Potato yellow PLU code?

- A. 4727**

PLU codes identify the exact produce item you're purchasing at checkout. For conventional yellow potatoes, the standard four-digit code is 4727. The four-digit format signals non-organic produce, while five-digit codes that start with 9 indicate organic varieties. The other numbers point to different produce items, so they wouldn't be used for yellow potatoes. This is why 4727 is the correct code to look for.

PLU codes identify specific produce items at checkout, with four-digit numbers used for conventional (non-organic) items. The other numbers correspond to different produce items or varieties and would not produce the Pepper Red price. If you ever encounter organic produce, you'll see a five-digit PLU starting with a 9, which helps distinguish it from conventional numbers.

PLU codes are four-digit numbers used at checkout to identify loose produce and set its price. If the fruit were organic, you'd see a 9 added in front (94044), but that's a separate category from the conventional code 4044.

The other items point to different produce with their own codes, so they don't identify Peach Eastern.

PLU codes are the quick identifiers the store uses to pull the exact item and price from the system. For bakery rolls in Stop & Shop's PLU catalog, the code assigned is 426. This specific code distinguishes rolls from other bakery items, ensuring the right price and department are applied at checkout. The other numbers correspond to different bakery items, so they wouldn't correctly identify rolls.

7. Which item has PLU 4017?

PLU codes help cashiers instantly identify the exact produce item and price. The four-digit code 4017 is the code assigned to Granny Smith apples, so this item matches that code. Other items like bananas, red grapes, or items from an olive bar have different PLU numbers, so they wouldn't be identified by 4017.

8. Which PLU code corresponds to Stamps?

PLU codes identify items at the register, including non-food items like stamps, so cashiers can ring them up quickly and accurately. The stamps category has a specific code, and in Stop & Shop's PLU system that code is 120. That's why this option is the correct one. The other numbers map to different products and wouldn't correctly identify stamps at checkout.

9. Plums PLU code?

PLU codes are four-digit numbers used at checkout to identify produce. For conventional plums, the assigned PLU is 4440, which is why this option is the best match. If the plums were organic, you'd typically see a five-digit code starting with a 9, such as 94440, but the common four-digit code for plums remains 4440. The other numbers correspond to different produce items, so they don't identify plums.

(Note: conventional produce uses 4-digit codes, while organic items have a leading 9, but the key idea is that 4612 uniquely identifies ginger in the PLU system.)
