**1. What is the difference between a code of ethics and a code of conduct?**

- A. They are identical in purpose.**

The main idea is that ethics deal with values and how you decide what's right in tricky situations, while a code of conduct spells out the specific rules and expected behaviors for daily actions. A code of ethics guides personal integrity and values—it tells you what principles to uphold, such as honesty, fairness, and respect, and how those principles influence your decisions. A code of conduct, on the other hand, lays out concrete rules and standards for behavior you must follow day to day, like punctuality, dress code, and procedures for reporting misconduct. So the idea that ethics simply lists day-to-day rules mixes up the two roles; those everyday rules belong in a code of conduct. Similarly, ethics aren't about fundraising, and they aren't identical to a conduct code.

The crest uses its top peaks to encode three intertwined ideas: our initials that identify each sister, devotion to sisterhood, and character as a guiding trait. By giving three peaks, the design highlights how individual identities come together within the group's shared values. This combination—that personal identity plus commitment to the sisterhood and the quality of character—is why this option fits best. If we imagined alternatives, two peaks would imply balance in a way that isn't the intended message here; four peaks would suggest four pillars, which isn't what the crest conveys; a single peak would point to unity alone, missing the personal and relational aspects that three peaks are meant to symbolize.

The amount is \$45 and it must be paid by initiation. This means the initiation fee is a fixed amount charged during the initiation process so your membership can be activated. Paying at the end of initiation would be after you've already completed the initiation, which isn't how the process is set up. Paying before joining isn't applicable because you're not a member yet to incur the fee. So, the correct requirement is \$45 paid by initiation.

4. The three peaks of the Sub Deb Club pin stand for which trio of values?

The symbol on the pin communicates a specific, shared standard that guides members. The three peaks point to three intertwined ideals: sisterhood, devotion, and character. Sisters support and stand with one another, forming a strong bond that defines their community. Devotion captures the ongoing commitment to the club, its activities, and the people it serves, showing up with consistency and heart. Character highlights the integrity and ethical conduct members strive to uphold in all actions and decisions. Together, these three values—unity among members, steadfast commitment, and personal integrity—shape how members behave, interact, and represent the group. Other value sets—like friendship with loyalty and integrity, or pride, tradition, service, or honor, courage, wisdom—touch on admirable traits but don't match the pin's intended emphasis on the exact trio of sisterhood, devotion, and character.

The main idea being tested is how a club serves its members through learning, discussion, and inclusive participation. The best choice describes fostering discussion, skills development, and membership through inclusive participation and programming. It highlights that the club aims to involve all members, help them grow, and stay active through thoughtfully designed activities, not just social events or financial aims. The other options, while they describe possible activities, don't capture the ongoing, inclusive, skill-building purpose that sustains member involvement and a vibrant community.

6. What do the Greek letters across the middle of the crest stand for?

- A. Our initials SDC in Greek**

Think of it as a way to encode the club's identity directly on the crest. The Greek letters shown are used to spell out the organization's initials in Greek characters—Sigma for S, Delta for D, and Chi for C—which together stand for SDC. This is a common styling choice on insignia: using letters to represent the name rather than a motto or a date. If it were a motto, you'd expect words with meaning; if it were the founding year, you'd see numbers. Here, the three Greek letters are simply the initials in Greek form, signaling the club's name across languages.

Disputes in a club are best handled through structured internal processes that protect members and the group's harmony. This approach includes mediation, which brings in a neutral facilitator to help everyone talk through the issue and find a voluntary agreement; a formal complaint process that ensures concerns are heard, investigated, and treated with due process; and escalation to the governing board when a decision or binding resolution is needed. These steps resolve issues fairly, preserve relationships, and keep matters within the club's rules and governance. Going to court can be costly and public; ignoring disputes lets tensions grow; and airing problems on social media can violate privacy and undermine the club's governance.

Roles in a club's leadership are designed to handle different governance tasks. The Vice President usually acts as the second-in-command and can step in for the President; the Scribe keeps official records and minutes; the Parliamentarian ensures meetings follow proper procedure. Historian is typically a position focused on preserving the club's history—photos, archives, and documenting events—rather than running meetings or managing daily operations, so it is not listed among the officer positions. Therefore, Historian is the role that does not fit the officer roster.

**9. What do the three candles on the crest symbolize?**

- A. The candles symbolize peace, harmony, and unity**

Candles on a crest are often used to show guiding values that a group aims to live by. When there are three lights, they're usually pointing to three core qualities that held together drive the organization's culture. Here, the three candles symbolize sisterhood, devotion, and character. Each candle stands for one value, and together they show how members support one another (sisterhood), stay committed to the group's goals (devotion), and build personal integrity through their actions (character). The light from the candles evokes guidance and warmth, illustrating how these values illuminate and strengthen the community. The other options describe admirable traits, but they don't fit as closely with what a sisterhood-focused crest emphasizes. For example, faith, hope, and charity come from a religious context and aren't as directly tied to the specific experience of being part of a sisterhood. The pairings of peace, harmony, and unity or wisdom, courage, and honor are great virtues, but they don't foreground the particular relationship, commitment, and personal growth themes that the trio on this crest is meant to convey.

**10. When was our club founded?**

- A. August 1964**
- B. August 1965**
- C. September 1965**
- D. July 1965**

The key idea is recognizing the exact month and year when the club was established. The club's official founding date is August 1965, so that pairing is the one that matches the historical record. The other options don't fit because they either move the year earlier (August 1964) or shift the month within the same year (July 1965 or September 1965), which would not be the founding moment. When a question asks when something was founded, you need the precise month and year of origin, not an anniversary or a guess. So August 1965 is the correct date.
