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Explanations

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1. The term 'pithy' is defined as

- A. Very verbose
- B. Lacking depth
- C. Using few words in a clever way**
- D. Poised and formal

Pithy describes language that is brief but meaningful, delivering a lot of meaning with just a few words and often with wit. That's why using few words in a clever way best captures the term. The other options miss the core idea: being very verbose is the opposite of pithy, lacking depth implies superficiality, and being poised and formal refers more to tone than to concise, sharp expression. So a pithy statement is concise and pointed, with possible cleverness.

2. Who does Petruchio introduce to Baptista and why is this character important?

- A. Litio from Mantua, who is Hortensio in disguise, to tutor Katharine and Bianca in music.**

Disguise and social maneuvering drive much of the action here. Petruchio introduces a Mantuan musician named Litio to Baptista, and Litio is Hortensio in disguise. The point is that this character appears as a legitimate music tutor to Katharine and Bianca, giving Hortensio a respectable role inside Baptista's household. That disguise lets Hortensio (Litio) court Bianca under the father's eye and shape the girls' piano/learning scene as a way to win favor, while also crossing paths with the other suitors in the plot. This use of a false identity shows how appearances and roles are used to influence marriage prospects and advance the schemes of Petruchio and his partners.

This item tests your ability to pick a word that conveys a friendly, approachable, easy-to-talk-to quality. Affable describes a person who is friendly and pleasant in conversation, making others feel welcome and at ease. Daunt means to intimidate or discourage, Pine means to long for or yearn, and Chide means to scold or rebuke; none of these capture the sense of sociable warmth the prompt asks for. So affable is the best fit, as it directly conveys the demeanor of someone who is agreeable and easy to approach.

The ending centers on irony. Petruchio seems to have won the control he sought—Kate's public submission, the display of obedience to her husband, and the sense that the battle of the sexes has tilted in his favor. Yet the tone is not a simple triumph; Kate's final stance can be read as a deliberate, almost performative compliance that plays with audience expectations about gender and authority. This creates a double meaning: while Petruchio appears victorious, the scene invites us to question whether true change has occurred or if Kate is using wit and social theatrics to navigate and critique the very norms she's said to endorse. In that sense, the victory is ironic—the apparent triumph for Petruchio is undercut by the ambiguity and satire surrounding Kate's ultimate obedience.

5. What word is listed as the evidence of pithiness?

Pithiness is being concise. The evidence of that trait would be something that shows a higher degree of conciseness. The word that expresses "more brief" is the comparative form of brief. While today we usually spell it briefer, some variants appear as brefier, which is why this option fits best: it directly signals a greater brevity, i.e., more pithiness. The other choices don't convey that degree: brevity names the quality itself, brief is the base form, and brevier is a different, unrelated word.

6. Which term means 'showing pleasant, good natured qualities'?

This question tests vocabulary for describing personality and demeanor. Amiable means someone is friendly and good-natured, showing pleasant qualities in their behavior and interactions. That makes it the best fit for "showing pleasant, good natured qualities." Peevish describes irritability or a tendency to complain. Scornful conveys contempt or disdain. Deign is a verb meaning to stoop to do something beneath one's dignity, not a trait describing a person's temperament.

7. What is the dowry presented to Petruchio if he is successful in wooing Katharine?

A. Half of Baptista's land and 20,000 crowns.

B. A token ring and a horse.

C. One-quarter of the estate and 10,000 crowns.

In this scene, money and property are the practical backbone of marriage arrangements, showing how a husband's security and a father's control are negotiated through a dowry. The offer to Petruchio is substantial: half of Baptista's land and twenty thousand crowns if he succeeds in winning Katharine. This large dowry signals Baptista's willingness to secure Katharine's marriage with a strong financial incentive and reflects Petruchio's status as a wealthy suitor capable of taking on the responsibilities of marriage. The other options don't fit because they either downplay the stake involved, reference items not described as the dowry (like Bianca's dowry or minor tokens), or propose different sums or portions of the estate that aren't what the scene states.

8. What do Lucentio and Hortensio do to woo Bianca?

A. they fight over who gets to lecture Bianca first

B. they lecture Bianca together

C. they hire professionals

D. they bribe Bianca's nurse

In this moment, the plan to win Bianca hinges on appearances and competition. Lucentio and Hortensio both fall for Bianca and decide to woo her by posing as her tutors, hoping that education and conversation will win her favor. Because they're rivals in love, they end up trying to outdo one another, leading to a dispute over who should lecture Bianca first. This rivalry captures the playful, deceptive tactics the lovers use to gain Bianca's attention. The other options don't fit because the scene centers on their competition as would-be tutors, not on joint teaching, hiring outsiders, or bribing Bianca's nurse.

9. In the encounter with the haberdasher and tailor, what does Petruchio do when Katherine shows no gratitude?

A. Petruchio insults the tailor and calls the dress ugly and poor quality.

B. Petruchio praises their craftsmanship and pays them.

C. Petruchio orders a new dress to be made immediately.

D. Petruchio remains silent while Katherine comments.

The main idea here is Petruchio's tactic of winning favor and demonstrating authority through generosity and praise. When Katherine is ungrateful, he counterbalances her attitude by praising the haberdasher's and tailor's workmanship and promptly paying them. This shows his method: use positive reinforcement and control of resources to shape behavior and set a tone of civility, which also models how he wants Katherine to respond. Insulting the craftsmen, demanding a new dress, or remaining silent would not align with his approach of smoothing interactions and using money and praise to influence the situation.

10. Entreat means to

Entreat means to ask earnestly or beg someone to do something. This makes the best choice evident: it conveys a heartfelt, urgent appeal rather than issuing an order or proposal. Demand and Command imply force or authority to compel, which isn't about a sincere plea. Suggest means offering a possibility, not pressing someone with a earnest request. For example, you might entreat a friend to reconsider or plead with them to help, highlighting the emotion and humility in the request.
