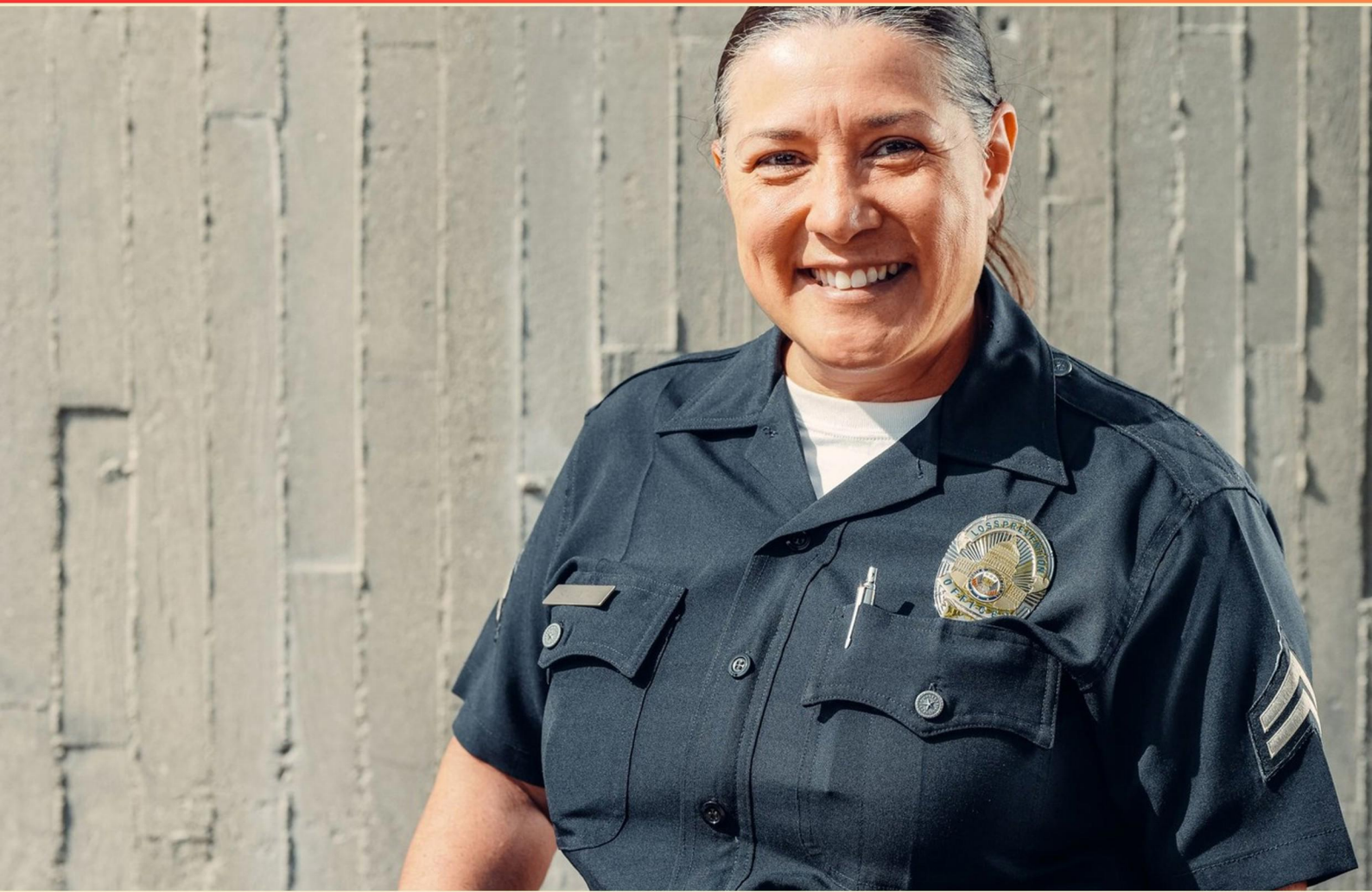

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Explanations

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1. Which offense applies to a person who possesses an unauthenticated firearm in a public place?
