The focus on airlifting troops specifically demonstrated a collaborative international approach to addressing humanitarian needs, which was a key aspect of the operation's success.

Thus, the establishment of a separate Air Force stands out as a clear and crucial impact of the National Security Act

The United States troop withdrawal from Iraq was officially completed on December 18, 2011. Coordinating international military exercises is more closely aligned with operational commands and strategic planning than with the logistical and materials-focused mission of the Air Force Material Command.

Operational command centers are command and control hubs that facilitate decision-making and communication, but they do not specifically address rest and relief for personnel stationed within logistics areas. Forward operating bases are tactical positions away from the main base, serving various operational roles but do not specifically provide the collective protective measures needed for personnel rest and safety in logistics storage scenarios.
