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Explanations

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1. Which device can help prevent unauthorized access to a computer network?

A firewall is specifically designed to monitor and control incoming and outgoing network traffic based on predetermined security rules, making it an essential device for preventing unauthorized access to a computer network. It acts as a barrier between a trusted internal network and untrusted external networks, such as the internet. For example, 255.255.0.0 is the default subnet mask for Class B addresses, while 255.255.255.128 is a custom mask often used for subnetting within Class C networks but is not the default. The mask 255.255.255.255 is a special mask that indicates a single host and is not applicable for a typical network scenario.

In the context of storage connections, it is important to remember that while the SATA interface supports various versions and speeds, the limitation here is purely based on how many physical connectors are present on the motherboard. Consequently, if there are only 4 SATA connectors available, then 4 is the total that can be supported, regardless of the potential capabilities offered by higher-end motherboards that might feature more connectors.
