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Explanations

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1. Which cadence ends on the dominant chord of a scale?

- A. Plagal Cadence

The cadence that ends on the dominant chord of a scale is the half cadence. A half cadence typically concludes with a V (dominant) chord, creating a sense of tension or the need for resolution, which often leads naturally into the next phrase or passage of music. This unresolved feeling is a defining characteristic of a half cadence, distinguishing it from other types of cadences, which either resolve or lead to a finality. In contrast, other cadences provide different types of resolutions or tonal conclusions. An authentic cadence leads to a clear resolution on the tonic chord (I), providing a strong sense of closure. Thus, the half cadence's characteristic ending on the dominant chord is what makes it the correct answer in this context.
