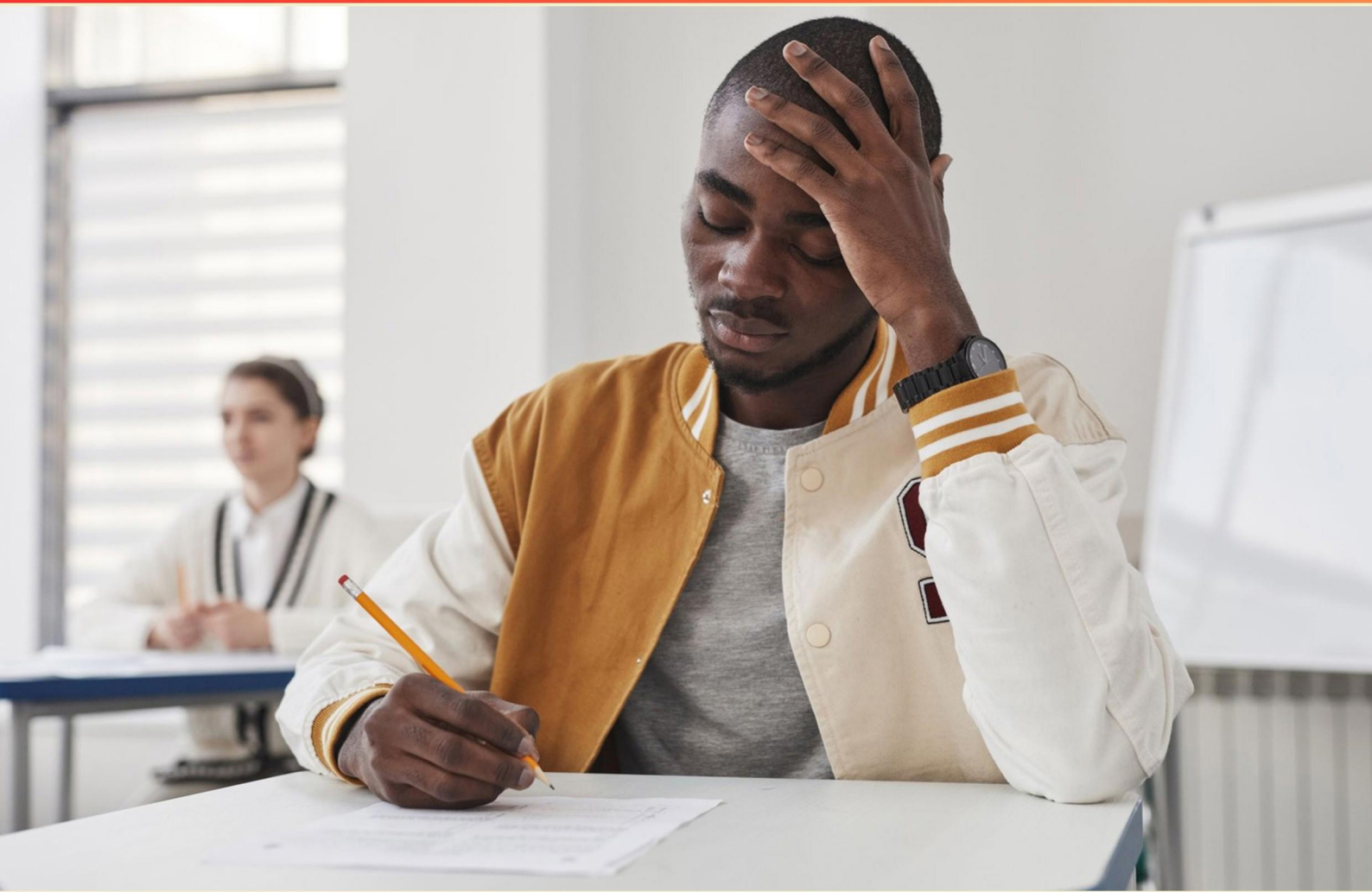

Hence, while all these terms relate to death care practices, "funeral establishment" is the most inclusive and accurate term for the business that provides these services.
