Self-determination is the principle that a nation has the right to determine its own political status and govern itself. It captures the idea of a free and sovereign government by affirming that a people can choose their own system of governance without external coercion, which is central in international law and post-colonial history. The other terms don't express this recognized right as clearly: they may refer to governance in general or to approaches in international relations, but not to the formal right of a nation to decide its own political future.

The main idea here is recognizing the Pacific trade route that linked Asia with the Americas during the colonial era. This link made Manila a hub for Asian trade and Acapulco a gateway for wealth from the Americas, illustrating early globalization across oceans. The other options don't reflect this famous pairing. Beijing and Mexico City aren't connected by a trans-Pacific galleon route, London and Bombay pertain to different maritime networks, and while there was trade involving Lima and Manila in broader contexts, the classic Galleon Trade specifically refers to Manila and Acapulco.

Technoscape describes how technology moves across borders—the devices, software, engineering know-how, and the networks that transfer them worldwide. It emphasizes the speed and scale of technological diffusion and how these flows reshape economies, politics, and everyday life. Other scapes focus on different things: mediascape on the circulation of information and images, ethnoscape on people and migration, financescape on money flows, and ideoscape on ideas and ideologies. So the flow of technology across borders is best captured by technoscape.

Globalization captures the expansion and deepening of social relations and consciousness that connect people and places across the world, spanning world-time and world-space. This means more frequent interactions across borders and a growing sense of a shared global life, not just bigger but tighter links. For example, international trade, global media, and cross-border social movements illustrate both the wider reach and the faster, more integrated nature of modern connections. Globalism is related but tends to refer to an ideology or policy stance toward global integration, whereas globalization names the actual process itself.

Sovereignty means the ultimate, independent authority over a defined territory. Saying that the State has sovereignty over its territory directly ties that supreme power to the land it governs, and to the people within it. It signals that within those borders, the state is the final authority for making and enforcing laws, free from outside control. The other phrases describe governance—having authority over people, ruling a area, or crafting rules—but they don't by themselves establish the essential link between supreme authority and the territory. The explicit statement about the state's sovereignty over its territory best captures the idea that the state is the sole, ultimate power within its borders.

It provided a shared program, issued directives, and helped maintain loyalty to Soviet leadership, coordinating actions across diverse national contexts. It remained the main hub of international communist coordination until its dissolution in 1943 as wartime politics evolved. Afterward, Cominform emerged in the late 1940s as a European-focused coordinating body, not a worldwide one. The Socialist International assembles social-democratic parties and does not direct Communist parties globally, while the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics is a single state, not an international organization directing other parties.

His vision sits at the intersection of national self-determination and a cooperative international system, unlike the other thinkers who foreground different foundations for peace or society.

A federation is a union of semi-autonomous regions under a central government, which may still host multiple nations. So, describing it as a country best captures the idea of a distinct political unit tied to a national community.

This belief in legitimacy aimed to prevent liberal or nationalist upheavals and keep a balance of power among the great nations, rather than spreading democracy or creating a single European government. By restoring the world of monarchical, hereditary, and religious privileges, the Concert of Europe sought to preserve the pre-revolutionary social and political framework that many rulers believed secured peace.

Focusing on liberal internationalism alone misses the deeper call for global solidarity, while focusing only on socialist internationalism misses the legal frameworks and mechanisms that enable cross-border cooperation. Nationalism, by contrast, centers on sovereignty and self-interest, which conflicts with internationalist principles.
