The thing this question tests is how the greasers see Darry in terms of his role in the family. They view him as a strong, protective older brother who shoulders a lot of responsibility. That's why the nickname Superman fits best—it signals hero-like strength, reliability, and a willingness to do what needs to be done to keep everyone safe. In the story, Darry's tough, steady, and protective nature makes him come across like a real-life guardian, much like a superhero to Ponyboy and Soda, which is exactly what that nickname conveys. The other options don't match this specific image of Darry as the protective, dependable older brother, so Superman is the most fitting choice.

This line shows Ponyboy's point of view and how he sees his older brother, Darry. When Ponyboy says someone is "hard as a rock" and "about as human," he's describing Darry's tough, demanding exterior—Darry is strict, protective, and often emotionally distant because he has to shoulder a lot of responsibility for the family. The follow-up bit, "He thinks I'm a pain in the neck," reveals the strain in their relationship: Darry's sternness clashes with Ponyboy's desire for understanding and freedom. This combination—Ponyboy's sensitive narrator voice and the tense yet caring family dynamic—fits Ponyboy as the speaker, and matches the tone of scenes where Ponyboy reflects on why Darry seems hard while still loving him.

Sodapop, being between them in age and temperament, cares about both and acts as the peacemaker, easing tensions and mediating when their fights flare up. Dally and Steve aren't part of that specific family dynamic, so they don't typically serve as the middle ground between Ponyboy and Darry.

Darry is the oldest Curtis brother and acts as the parental figure for Ponyboy and Soda. The narrative places him in his early adulthood, around twenty, which fits his role of supporting the family and enforcing rules at home. Because Ponyboy and Soda are younger brothers, Darry's age being twenty shows he's a young adult trusted with major responsibilities, not a teen. This explanation aligns with how the book describes their family dynamics and Darry's character, making Twenty the best answer.

5. Why were the girls alone at the drive-in?

This question focuses on the moment's social setup: why the girls are at the drive-in in that scene. The key point the text emphasizes is the presence of alcohol brought by the boyfriends, not a desire for privacy or any other motive.

Sodapop Curtis is the middle Curtis boy. In the story, Darry is the oldest and Ponyboy is the youngest, so Sodapop sits between them in age. He's often called "Soda" for short, which can help remember him as the middle brother.

7. What is visible on both the East and West sides of town?

Sunsets are visible from multiple parts of town because they occur in the western sky, so anyone with a clear view toward the west can see the sun as it sets—whether you're on the east side or the west side. The idea relies on a horizon-wide view rather than needing a geographic feature to be present on both sides. If the view toward the western horizon isn't blocked, the sunset can be seen from anywhere in town, which is why this choice fits best. Rivers, smog, or mountains depend on specific local conditions and aren't guaranteed to appear on both sides, making them less universally observable.

8. Tim Shepherd is the leader associated with which gang?

Tim Shepherd is described as the leader of a Greaser gang. In *The Outsiders*, the Greasers are the poorer, streetwise group who clash with the wealthier Socs, and Tim leads one of the Greaser factions on the West Side. The other names don't fit: the Socs are their rivals, and Jets/Sharks come from a different story altogether. So the best fit is the Greasers.

9. Which term describes judging individuals based on a generalization about a group?

Stereotype is a generalized belief about a group that people use to judge individual members. This fits the idea of applying a broad generalization about a group to a particular person, which then shapes how you view or treat that person. For example, thinking that all members of a group are a certain way leads you to make assumptions about someone you meet from that group, even if their personal actions contradict the generalization. Bias describes a tendency or preference, often unconscious, that colors judgment but isn't itself the act of applying a generalization about a group to a person. Prejudice is a preconceived negative or positive attitude toward a group, which can stem from stereotypes but remains an attitude rather than the generalizable belief about a group. Empathy is the ability to understand and share someone else's feelings, which is in direct contrast to judging them based on group generalizations. So the term that best captures judging individuals based on a generalization about a group is the stereotype, because it specifically refers to that mental generalization used to assess people.

10. Which greaser used to be a member of a New York City gang?

A. Ponyboy

B. Johnny

Dally Winston grew up in New York City and was part of a street gang there before coming to Tulsa. That past explains his hard-edged, fearless demeanor and willingness to resort to violence, traits that stand out even among the other greasers. The other characters—Ponyboy, Johnny, and Steve—don't have that NYC-gang background, so the clue points directly to Dally.
