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Explanations

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1. Who are Zoe's two best friends?

A. Brooke and Chelsea

B. Maya and Sophie

C. Anna and Lily

This question is about identifying Zoe's closest companions from what the material says. The two names Brooke and Chelsea are described as Zoe's best friends, so this pairing directly matches who she relies on the most and spends the most time with. That alignment with the stated relationships makes it the best fit. The other name pairs appear in different contexts or as acquaintances, not described as Zoe's top two, so they don't match the requirement of identifying her best friends. If you're unsure in the future, locate the section where Zoe talks about who she spends the most time with or who she considers her closest friends, and base your choice on that description.

2. What does Zoe say is the reward for uncovering who dumped the hazardous materials?

The idea being tested is that true reward comes from doing the right thing, not from easy shortcuts or external perks. Zoe says the reward for uncovering who dumped the hazardous materials is doing what's right, not what's easy. This highlights moral courage and integrity—the act of choosing honesty and responsibility becomes its own payoff, a sense of inner satisfaction and trust built with others. Monetary prize, public recognition, or a tangible gift like a new bicycle would be external rewards. They don't capture the internal fulfillment Zoe emphasizes when someone chooses the right course of action, even if it's harder.

3. Which character has electric blue hair?

We're focusing on recognizing a distinctive visual detail that sets a character apart. Electric blue hair is a bold, unusual feature used to mark someone in descriptions or artwork. The other options don't fit this clue because their corresponding letters wouldn't line up to form a familiar leadership word with this particular stack of titles.

6. What does Lina see after the group agrees to give up and go home?

The moment tests your ability to infer what the setting signals about where Lina is headed. After the group agrees to give up and go home, what she sees should mark a shift toward safety and a private space they can return to. A driveway does this most clearly: it's a concrete edge between public space and a home, signaling they're near shelter and about to enter a familiar, private place. That visual cues the end of their outdoor effort and the start of resting at home. The other options don't communicate that same sense of arriving at a personal, domestic space: a river suggests continued travel or crossing water; a lodge implies staying somewhere else rather than heading home; a road sign indicates direction, not the destination itself. So the driveway best fits the moment Lina experiences.

7. Where did Dad say the industrial toxins he tested seemed to come from?

The scenario points to chemicals associated with printing—inks and the solvents used to mix and clean them. If Dad's tests showed compounds typical of those printing-related chemicals, the most plausible source is the place where those materials are actually used and released: the print shop. A newspaper is produced there, but it isn't the source of the toxins itself; a library isn't connected to industrial chemical production; a warehouse could store chemicals but wouldn't explain toxins with a signature matching printing processes. So the evidence directly points to the print shop.

Pizza is described as Mom's dinner order during the scene where the team is organizing information. This choice shows a casual, collaborative mood: pizza is something easy to share and keeps the group energized as they work through clues and data together. The other meals would imply different vibes or contexts—spaghetti might feel messier or more homey, salad suggests a lighter option not typical for a long, focused session, and sushi can signal a different cultural tone or formality. The pizza detail fits the idea of a group, late-work vibe where teammates stick together to piece information together.

The key idea is spotting the exact beneficiary named by the character. That precise combination—"Literacy Program" plus a named institution—is what makes this option correct. It isn't just donating to a general entity like "the Public Library," nor to a broader or unrelated recipient like "a Literacy Charity" or "the Local Museum." The text specifies that exact program and library, so recognizing the precise phrasing and proper nouns is essential. When questions ask what someone will donate to, look for the exact named program or institution that follows the donation, not a vague or generic description.

10. Special Agent Tyree says a certain item would be the most important piece of evidence. What is it?

A. Plates

B. Photos

C. Map

D. Key

Identifying information that directly pinpoints a target is extremely powerful in an investigation, and a license plate provides that kind of specificity. A plate can uniquely identify the exact vehicle involved, which lets investigators trace it to its owner, check registration records, and correlate with surveillance footage, toll records, or parking entries to establish when and where the vehicle was present. This kind of direct linkage is much more conclusive than a photograph, which can be altered or misinterpreted, a map, which shows locations but not who or what was involved, or a key, which may unlock something but doesn't prove involvement. With a plate, the trail to suspects, timelines, and locations becomes much clearer.
