In contrast, options that suggest fixing the defect within 10 working days or simply indicating that no action is necessary do not align with the established procedures and policies surrounding changes in official documentation. Additionally, a fine could imply a more severe penalty for non-compliance, which is not the case in this situation where the focus is on rectification rather than penalization. Therefore, the response correctly emphasizes the importance of taking prompt action to amend the notice while also indicating financial responsibility for administrative oversight.*

Additionally, suggesting that an RV must be driven by a commercial driver is misleading since many RVs can be operated by individuals with regular driver's licenses, thus accommodating a broader audience.*
