Prepositions are words that typically show the relationship between a noun or pronoun and other words in a sentence. In this question, the correct answer is option B: By, for, and on. Therefore, option B is the correct choice as it consists only of prepositions. The other options are not correct: - Option A: Before and at are prepositions, but "yet" is not a preposition. - Option C: And, but, and or are coordinating conjunctions, not prepositions. - Option D: Up and with could be prepositions, but "nor" is a coordinating conjunction.

In contrast, the other sentences utilize restrictive clauses, which are integral to the meaning of the sentence since they specify which dog is being referred to. Thus, they do not correctly illustrate the use of a nonrestrictive clause.

In contrast, pronouns are used to replace nouns in order to avoid repetition, adverbs modify verbs, adjectives provide descriptive qualities to nouns, and none of these fulfill the same role as nouns in naming various aspects of our world. Hence, the correct classification of a word that signifies a person, place, thing, quality, idea, or action is indeed a noun.
