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Explanations

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1. Which statement correctly describes Maya Rudolph's background?

A. SNL cast member, comedian, and UCSC alumna

B. UC Berkeley alumna and actress

Maya Rudolph is best described by her work as a longtime SNL cast member and comedian, along with her education at UC Santa Cruz, making her UCSC alumna. This pairing—famous for sketch comedy on Saturday Night Live and having studied at UCSC—is the most accurate and recognizable summary of her background. The other descriptions don't fit because they point to different institutions or roles that aren't part of her widely known story.

2. Engaging Education (E^2) provides two resources. Which of the following is one of them?

Engaging Education is about connecting students with resources that promote inclusion and participation, especially for those who are underrepresented. The resource that fits this aim is the one that directly focuses on outreach to underrepresented students, providing access, information, and support to help them engage with opportunities. That's why Ch.U.C.K. Library, Outreach to underrepresented students is the correct resource listed. The other options describe facilities or programs that don't clearly represent outreach to underrepresented students, so they aren't identified as part of Engaging Education in this context.

3. What is our only online major?

Understanding what an online major means helps here: it's a degree designed to be completed mostly or entirely through online coursework, with no required on-campus classes. In this context, Creative Technologies is the only major described as online, built for remote learning and digital collaboration. That fits the idea of an online major, whereas Digital Arts, Online Media, and Computer Science are typically offered as on-campus programs or do not exist as fully online majors in this setting. So, Creative Technologies is the one designed to be taken online.

4. Which climate feature is not typical of Santa Cruz?

Santa Cruz's climate is shaped by its Pacific coastal location, where the ocean moderates temperatures and the marine layer brings fog. This creates a mild Mediterranean pattern: rainfall concentrated in winter and dry summers, with summers that stay fairly comfortable rather than extreme. Coastal fog is a hallmark of this coast, helping keep mornings cool and afternoons mild. Rainfall occurs mostly in winter, with summers remaining comparatively dry. Very hot, dry summers aren't typical because the ocean breeze and fog prevent the kind of heat extremes you'd expect inland. So the feature that doesn't fit Santa Cruz is very hot, dry summers.

5. How much is the pottery co-op for access for the entire school year?

The key idea is that this is an annual access fee. In a pottery co-op, paying a flat amount for the entire school year means you can use the studio all year long in exchange for one upfront cost. That price is set to cover the ongoing needs of running the space—equipment maintenance, safety oversight, and general access to facilities and shared tools—without charging per visit. Because the question specifies access for the full year, the correct amount is the yearly rate that aligns with that arrangement. The other amounts would correspond to shorter-term access or different inclusions, not the full-year access described here.

6. TAG stands for?

TAG stands for Transfer Admission Guarantee. This is a formal program some UC campuses offer to California community college students, promising admission if you meet specific requirements like maintaining a minimum GPA, completing designated transfer coursework and general education patterns, and applying by a campus deadline. It's a structured transfer route rather than a generic promise of admission, which is why this phrase best fits the acronym. The other options describe ideas that aren't how TAG is actually named or used—for example, something about accreditation or a broader admissions guarantee—so they don't match the established program.

7. Which off-campus site is associated with the Baskin School of Engineering?

The main idea here is recognizing where Baskin School of Engineering operates its off-campus, specialized activities. The Westside Research Park is the off-campus site associated with Baskin, serving as a hub for engineering research, labs, and collaborations with industry. It provides space for hands-on projects, prototypes, and partnerships that extend the engineering program beyond the main campus. The Coastal Science Campus focuses on marine and environmental science, the UCSC Silicon Valley Campus hosts other UCSC programs in Silicon Valley, and the Santa Cruz Engineering Center is not the designated off-campus Baskin site. So, the Westside Research Park is the correct association.

8. Which UCSC Alumni is associated with the Black Panther Party as a founder?

Huey P. Newton is recognized as one of the founders of the Black Panther Party, which he established in 1966 alongside Bobby Seale in Oakland. His collaboration with Seale created the party's early platform, emphasizing self-defense, Black empowerment, and community programs to address police brutality and inequality. Newton's leadership and writings became central to the Panthers' identity and goals, making his name closely tied to the origins of the movement. The other figures listed were influential in related civil rights and Black liberation efforts, but they did not found the Black Panther Party.

9. What is the official name of the Porter "Squiggle"?

In art labeling, when a work isn't given a specific title by the artist, catalogs often use the neutral label Untitled. The Porter "Squiggle" is treated this way, so its official catalog name is Untitled. This avoids implying meaning or a chosen name for the mark, letting the piece speak for itself. The other options would assign a concrete title or a descriptive label, which isn't how this work is officially cataloged.

10. How might climate change impact banana slug populations in the UCSC region?

Climate change reshapes where a species can live by altering two key environmental factors: moisture and temperature. Banana slugs need cool, consistently moist conditions under logs, leaf litter, and dense canopy—conditions often provided by coastal fog and regular rainfall in the UCSC area. When temperatures rise or moisture declines, those moist microhabitats shrink or dry out, making large swaths of current slug habitat less suitable. Temperature changes can also speed up or slow down developmental stages and breeding timing, so life cycle events may shift and misalign with food availability or seasonal cues. Slugs are not poised to thrive everywhere under warmer conditions; their advantage is tied to persistent moisture, so they're more likely to retreat to remaining damp pockets or shift their range rather than simply increasing everywhere. This combination—reduced suitable habitat and altered timing—explains why changes in moisture and temperature are the most plausible impact of climate change on these populations in that region.
