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## **Explanations**

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## 1. What does the Sixth Amendment guarantee?

- A. The right to a fair and speedy trial

*The Sixth Amendment to the United States Constitution is a critical component of the Bill of Rights that guarantees several important rights to individuals accused of crimes. One of its key provisions is the guarantee of the right to a fair and speedy trial. This ensures that individuals are not subjected to prolonged detention without a timely resolution of their case, promoting the idea that justice should not be delayed. The notion that the federal government can override state decisions conflicts with the independence granted in dual federalism. Lastly, the idea that states are dependent on federal laws and regulations undermines the principle of state sovereignty that dual federalism aims to uphold.*

For example, regulating commerce, collecting taxes, and controlling the press fall under different aspects of government powers and individual rights, which are addressed in other amendments or sections of the Constitution.*

For instance, water supply and sewage disposal would typically be managed by local government entities rather than a state-level commission that specializes in utility regulation. Similarly, transportation, housing, and education are managed by different state departments, and waste management, public safety, and health services usually fall under public health and local government responsibilities. Therefore, the emphasis on electricity, natural gas, and telecommunications distinctly aligns with the role of the Georgia Public Service Commission.
