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Explanations

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1. Which of the following is an example of when enlisted members would exchange salutes?

Salutes are a form of military courtesy exchanged when a service member is reporting to or addressing a superior officer. In formation, enlisted members render a report to the commander or a senior, and part of that reporting procedure involves a salute to acknowledge the officer's authority and begin the exchange. That moment clearly demonstrates the ceremonial element of saluting tied to formal reporting in a unit setting, making it the best example of when enlisted members would exchange salutes. Greeting a fellow enlisted member isn't a salute because it's a casual interaction among peers. Approaching a vehicle for inspection can involve procedures and safety checks but doesn't inherently require the salute exchange. Attending a civilian ceremony isn't a military setting and doesn't establish the standard salute exchange between service members.

Because it's continuous and career-spanning, it goes beyond a single course or job and continually shapes how a leader handles increasingly complex responsibilities. Leadership training tends to be discrete programs with a defined start and end, while professional growth and career progression describe broader ideas of development or advancement but don't inherently capture the sustained, leadership-focused cultivation over a lifetime. Therefore, the description fits leader development.

Immediate action for a semi-automatic pistol centers on quickly diagnosing and clearing a stoppage so you can get back to firing. Start by ensuring the magazine is properly seated; tapping the magazine helps snap it fully in and can fix a feed lip issue that prevents a round from entering the chamber. Next, attempt to fire by squeezing the trigger. This checks whether a round is actually in the chamber and ready to ignite. If the firearm still doesn't fire, the following step is to rack the slide. Cycling the slide ejects the round (or a dud) and chambers a fresh one, clearing the malfunction so you can try again. This sequence—tap the magazine, squeeze the trigger, rack the slide—addresses the common causes of a failure to fire and provides a quick path to restoring operation.

Contour lines show how elevation changes across the land, and a valley forms where elevation dips toward the valley floor on both sides. As you move across the map through that low area, the lines bend toward the valley axis, creating a V or a shallow U shape with the point of the V (or the open end of the U) oriented toward higher ground upstream. That pattern distinguishes valleys from hills (which show concentric circles around a high point) and from saddles or passes (which can look like an hourglass). So valleys are depicted by contour lines that form a V or U shape.

The selectable-fire option allows shooting either semi-automatic or a limited three-round burst, which has been a standard feature on many configurations. The other options describe a different weapon entirely: a larger-caliber 7.62mm bolt-action rifle, a 9mm pistol, or a lever-action rifle, none of which match the M4's modern, gas-operated, magazine-fed design and its select-fire capability.

Trust is the bedrock because the profession of arms is inherently a team effort that relies on dependable cooperation under pressure. Integrity, courage, and discipline are essential and support trust—integrity earns it, courage demonstrates commitment in danger, and discipline ensures consistent, disciplined action—but without trust, those qualities can't translate into coordinated, reliable teamwork. Trust binds individuals into a cohesive unit, enabling decisive action when it matters most.

ARSOF core attributes denote the fundamental qualities that let operators succeed across diverse and demanding missions. Capability is the core attribute explicitly named in that framework, embodying the ability to execute tasks and achieve outcomes under a variety of conditions. While ingenuity and flexibility are valuable and often enhance performance, they are not the attribute the official ARSOF list designates as a core attribute. Humor isn't listed as a core attribute either. So capability is the best answer because it is the term the ARSOF framework uses to describe the essential capacity to perform.

Focusing on how a counselor effectively supports others, the emphasis is on how they relate to and understand the person being counseled. Respect for subordinates is fundamental because it establishes a professional, nonjudgmental environment where soldiers feel valued and safe to share concerns. Self-awareness is crucial because the counselor must recognize their own biases, emotions, and limitations to avoid clouding judgment and to stay objective. Empathy is essential for truly understanding the subordinate's perspective, enabling appropriate guidance and support. Courage, while highly valuable in many military roles, isn't a trait that directly governs the counselor's ability to listen, validate, or guide someone through personal or emotional issues, and so it isn't listed as a quality of an effective counselor in this context.
