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Explanations

Thus, recognizing zombies as victims of a curse helps to illustrate the rich tapestry of beliefs and fears that shape their depiction worldwide.

Vampires, while iconic in folklore, are usually depicted in the context of undead lore and often have associations with predation rather than healing or religious practice.

The focus on climate-related debates underscores the interconnectedness of cultural practices surrounding death with the broader challenges posed by our changing environment.
