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Explanations

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1. Which part of the body has the strongest muscles?

- A. Arms
- B. Back
- C. Neck
- D. Legs**

Absolute strength comes from muscle size and the demands placed on a muscle. The legs contain some of the body's largest muscle groups—the quadriceps, hamstrings, gluteals, and calves—which have a large cross-sectional area and work together to support body weight, push off the ground, and propel movement. That combination of big muscles and high daily load means the leg muscles can produce more force than the muscles in the arms or neck. Arm muscles are strong for their size and fine-movement tasks, but they're smaller overall, and neck muscles are relatively small since they mainly stabilize the head. So, in terms of raw strength, the strongest muscles are in the legs.

2. Which service would deliver by the end of the next business day for residential customers?

- A. Next Day Air Saver**

Delivery by the end of the next business day comes from a next-day service that prioritizes a late-day arrival rather than an early-morning or midday delivery. Next Day Air Saver is the option designed to get a package to a residential address by the end of the next business day, offering a more economical rate than the standard Next Day Air, which targets earlier delivery times. Ground and 3 Day Select are slower than next-day services and wouldn't meet the "end of the next business day" requirement. So, the service that fits that delivery window for residential customers is Next Day Air Saver.

3. Which package type is explicitly not eligible for driver release?

High-value electronics often have delivery restrictions that require a signed receipt. The option describing a laptop package is not eligible for driver release because it must be handed directly to the recipient (or an authorized signer) to ensure proper authorization and reduce theft risk. The other package types are typically able to be released by a driver under pre-approved terms or delivered to a valid delivery location with appropriate authorization. So, the laptop package is the one that explicitly cannot be released by the driver.

4. CPad views are used for which purpose?

CPad views provide the driver with stop-specific guidance, showing notes, procedures, or alerts attached to each stop so you know exactly what to do at that location—like special delivery instructions, access details, or any safety notes before you proceed. This makes per-stop actions clear and helps prevent missed steps or mis deliveries. Scheduling deliveries isn't handled in the CPad; that happens through route planning. Recording fuel usage is tracked by telematics or fuel logs, not the CPad. Communicating with customers uses separate tools, not the CPad.

5. In the Object or Ground task, how should Streetlight be labeled?

This question tests how the Object or Ground labeling decides whether something is part of the surface or a separate item in the scene. A streetlight is fixed to the ground and is considered a fixture of the surface rather than a standalone object you would lift or move. In this labeling scheme, that association with the ground means it should be labeled as ground. Labeling it as an object would imply it's a discrete item separate from the surface, which isn't how this task groups elements. Hazard isn't the right category for general labeling unless the item is specifically a risk, and Unknown is used only when the category can't be determined. So the streetlight is labeled as ground.

6. After arriving at their final car destination at the end of the day, which of the following must the DSP do?

A. Document the delivery in the log

B. Secure the Carry Aid

C. Return to the hub

D. Notify supervisor

The action being tested is end-of-day safety and equipment security. After you reach the final car destination, you must secure the Carry Aid. This step protects the equipment from loss or tampering and ensures it's ready for use by the next shift, which is why it's the required action. Logging deliveries is typically done as you complete each stop, not a mandatory end-of-day action. Returning to the hub isn't always required if you've finished your route for the day, depending on policy. Notifying a supervisor is reserved for issues or exceptions, not a standard end-of-day requirement.

7. Can a residential but not high risk or COD package be driver released?

Driver release is allowed when the shipment does not require a signature and is not COD, and the shipper has authorized leaving the package at the delivery location. For a residential shipment that isn't high risk and isn't COD, there's no signature requirement to meet, so the driver can release the package at the door or another approved spot without a recipient present. This avoids unnecessary delays and aligns with shipper instructions. If a shipment did require a signature or COD, driver release wouldn't be permitted, which is why these conditions matter.

8. Who is the person with overall responsibility for center operations?

The person with overall responsibility for center operations is the one who holds accountability for the center's performance, resources, and strategic direction. This role oversees budgets, staffing, policy compliance, safety, and cross department coordination to ensure service levels and goals are met. The center supervisor handles day-to-day supervision, the operations lead focuses on running and improving core processes, and the center clerk handles administrative tasks. Therefore, the business manager is the best fit for overall responsibility.

9. Aiming high in steering helps the DSP keep the vehicle centered in the traffic lane.

What you focus on while steering shapes how you steer. Aiming high means looking well down the lane and picking a far, central point to guide your path. When your gaze is far ahead, you receive more time to plan and smooth out your steering, so small, gradual inputs keep the car centered rather than chasing the lane edges. This long lead helps you follow the lane's curvature more naturally and reduces the tendency to overcorrect when you see the road ahead. So, using a high look-ahead target makes it easier to maintain a steady, centered position in the traffic lane, which is why this practice is considered effective in keeping the vehicle aligned. While road conditions can influence how you steer in a given moment, the fundamental benefit of aiming high is consistent: it supports smoother control and better lane centering.

10. Pedestrians do not need to follow traffic signs or signals.

All road users, including pedestrians, must follow traffic control devices. Pedestrians are required to obey walk and don't-walk signals, crosswalk markings, and any signs directing pedestrian movement. These controls help prevent collisions by coordinating where and when people and vehicles move through an intersection. For example, you should not start crossing when a don't-walk signal is shown or when turning vehicles have the right of way; you should only cross when it's safe and permitted by the signals or signs. Saying pedestrians do not need to follow traffic signs or signals would undermine safety and isn't correct.
