It also isn't about acting only when supervision exists, which would breed inconsistency and doubt. Integrity requires steadfast adherence to what is legally and morally appropriate, regardless of who is watching.

That demand drove standardization of calibers and cartridges, and the adoption of interchangeable parts and uniform components, so weapons and ammo from different arsenals could be fed into the same supply chain and repaired more easily in the field. A network of national arsenals and depots developed, accompanied by formal inspection, testing, and standardized manufacturing practices. This move from ad hoc production to a coordinated, standardized system laid the groundwork for modern ordnance practices and set the pattern later generations would expand upon during subsequent modernization waves.
