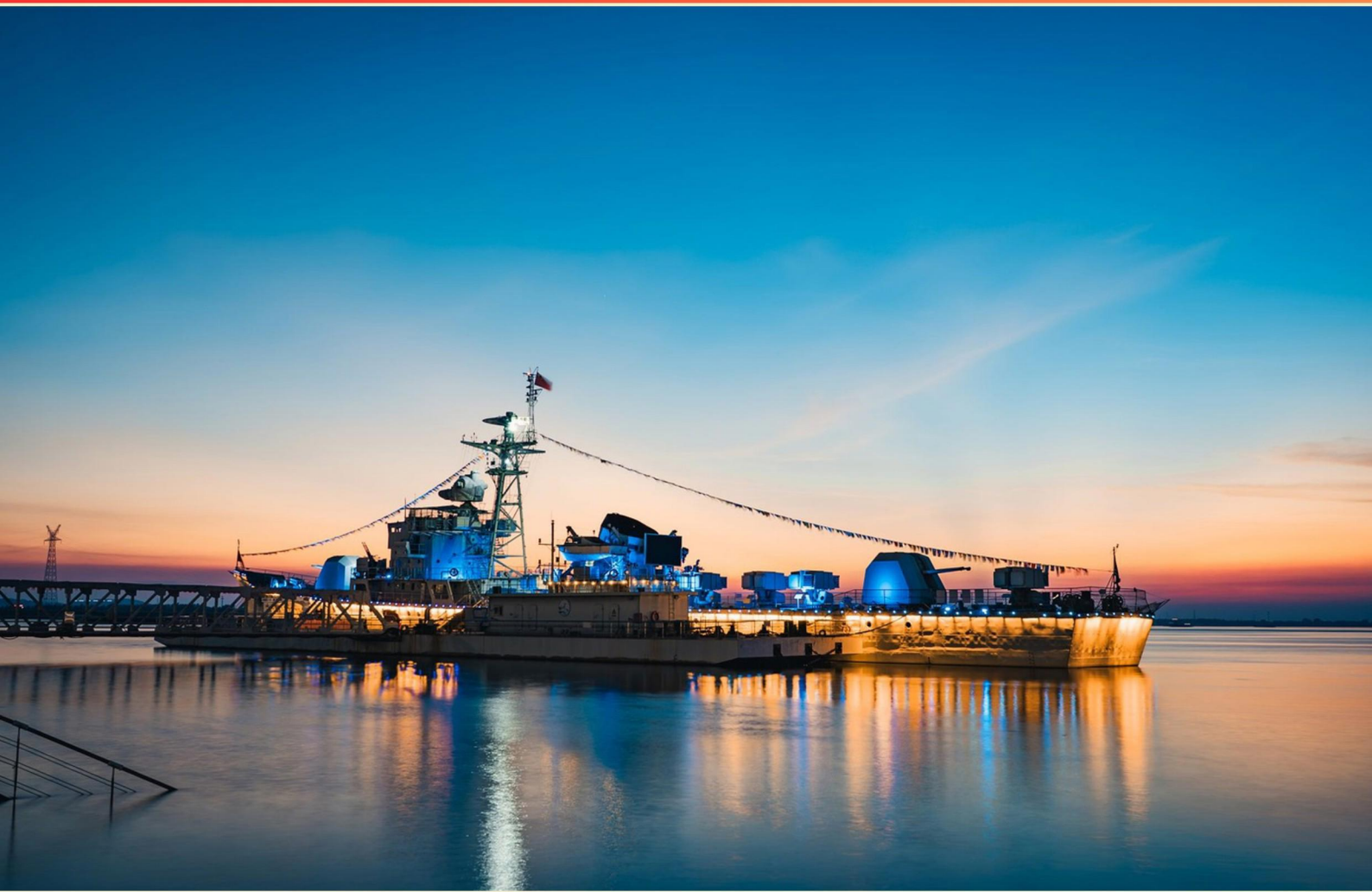

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Explanations

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1. What is the U.S. Navy's official motto?

- A. For God and Country
- B. Non sibi, sed patriae**
- C. Semper Fi
- D. Non nobis solum

Non sibi, sed patriae translates to "Not for self, but for country," and that is the U.S. Navy's official motto. It appears on official seals and Navy insignia, underscoring a tradition of service to the nation over personal gain. The other phrases belong to different groups or contexts—Semper Fi is the Marine Corps motto; For God and Country is a patriotic motto used in various contexts but not official Navy motto; Non nobis solum is used in other settings and isn't the Navy's motto.

2. Petty Officer is a term that applies to an individual in which paygrade range?

Petty Officer is used for the Navy's first set of non-commissioned officers, covering paygrades E-4 through E-6. These three ranks are Petty Officer Third Class (E-4), Petty Officer Second Class (E-5), and Petty Officer First Class (E-6). Sailors in the lower enlisted ranks (E-1 to E-3) have different titles like Seaman Recruit, Seaman Apprentice, and Seaman, and aren't called petty officers. Those who advance beyond E-6 (E-7 and above) have distinct titles such as Chief Petty Officer, Senior Chief Petty Officer, and Master Chief Petty Officer. So the term applies specifically to E-4 through E-6.

3. What does AE stand for?

AE stands for Aviation Electrician's Mate. In Navy ratings, the two-letter abbreviation comes from the main words in the rating title, and this one specifically identifies someone who maintains and fixes electrical systems on aircraft—wiring, electrical components, power generation, lighting, and related avionics power systems. The other options don't reflect recognized Navy rating names, so they aren't the correct match.

4. Which paygrades are eligible for advancement exams in the enlisted ranks?

A. E-4 through E-7

B. E-1 through E-3

C. E-8 through E-9

D. E-2 through E-6

In enlisted advancement, the testing component is used for promotions from the lower noncommissioned ranks up to senior noncommissioned ranks. The exam is part of the process for advancing from Third Class up to Chief Petty Officer, meaning paygrades E-4 through E-7 take the advancement exam and have their score combined with time in rate and performance to determine eligibility. Promotions to E-8 and E-9 rely on a selection board rather than an exam, and those at E-1 through E-3 advance primarily through time in service and other criteria rather than this exam. Therefore, the paygrades eligible for advancement exams are E-4 through E-7.

5. Sonar Technician is abbreviated as?

In Navy ratings, each job specialty has a two-letter abbreviation derived from the words in the rating title. Sonar Technician is abbreviated as ST because the letters come from the two-part title (Sonar and Technician). This shorthand is used on insignia, rosters, and official documents to quickly identify a sailor's specialty. The other options correspond to different ratings—Yeoman (YN), Musician (MU), and Personnel Specialist (PS)—so they don't apply to Sonar Technician. The ST abbreviation specifically signals someone who works with sonar equipment and related undersea acoustics.

6. Which of the following is NOT an IW-L enlisted rating?

Information Warfare (IW) ratings focus on handling, protecting, and exploiting information and intelligence. Aviation Electronics Technician is not part of that realm; their role is maintaining and repairing aircraft avionics systems, which is an aviation maintenance field rather than information operations. The other three options are tied to information-related duties: Cryptologic Technician works with signals and intelligence; Information Systems Technician manages networks and information systems; Aerographer's Mate provides weather and ocean data that support operational planning and decision-making. So Aviation Electronics Technician is the one that does not fit IW-L.

7. What is the Command Master Chief (CMC) best described as?

- A. The senior-most enlisted member within a command; Special assistant to the CO**
- B. A commissioned officer who handles procurement

The Command Master Chief is the senior enlisted leader in a command and serves as the primary advisor to the commanding officer on enlisted matters and the welfare and readiness of the crew. This position acts as the main link between the sailors and the CO, ensuring that policies, training, discipline, and morale are effectively carried out and that the enlisted perspective is heard at the highest level. The other descriptions point to roles that belong to officers or to non leadership functions (a procurement officer, the ship's engineering chief, or a chaplain's aide), not the senior enlisted leader. So the best description is that the CMC is the senior-most enlisted member within a command and a special assistant to the CO.

8. What does AD stand for?

- A. Aviation Machinist's Mate**
- B. Aircraft Diagnostics

In Navy ratings, two-part names identify the specialty: the first part shows the field, the second part the specific duties. AD stands for Aviation Machinist's Mate, the rating that focuses on aircraft engines and other mechanical systems. The other terms listed aren't official Navy rating titles, so they don't match the meaning of AD.

9. What is the full name for the abbreviation LN?

- A. Logistics Specialist
- B. Intelligence Specialist
- C. Information Systems Technician
- D. Legalman**

LN stands for Legalman. In Navy ratings, the two-letter code maps to the official job title, and LN is the designation used for personnel who provide legal support under the JAG Corps. A Legalman handles tasks like preparing legal documents, assisting attorneys, conducting legal research, and organizing records or proceedings for courts-martial and civilian legal assistance programs. Other two-letter codes correspond to different ratings—for example, Logistics Specialist is LS, Intelligence Specialist is IS, and Information Systems Technician is IT—so LN uniquely identifies Legalman.

10. Personnel Specialist is abbreviated as?

In the Navy, each enlisted rating has a two-letter abbreviation that captures the job focus. The Personnel Specialist rating is all about administrative and personnel actions—handling assignments, personnel records, evaluations, pay-related paperwork, promotions, and general support for sailors and commands. That specific focus is why the standard abbreviation is PS. The other options point to different ratings: Operations Specialist handles sensors and weapons/navigation tasks, Musician covers musical support, and Yeoman is another administrative rating. So PS is the correct abbreviation for Personnel Specialist.
