Biannual testing could be too infrequent to adequately monitor changes in fitness levels among the members.

Intelligence Specialists deal with gathering and analyzing information, Electronics Technicians focus on maintaining and repairing electronic equipment, and Damage Controlmen are trained in fire-fighting, flooding control, and overall ship maintenance. While all these roles are crucial within the Coast Guard, they do not involve specialized diving skills.
