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Explanations

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1. What does the sign with a U-turn symbol indicate?

- A. Stop
- B. Do Not Enter
- C. U-Turn**
- D. No Parking

A sign showing a curved arrow forming a U tells you that making a U-turn is permitted at this location. It displays the required maneuver you may perform here, as long as it's safe and legal to do so. This isn't about stopping, entering from the wrong direction, or parking—those actions are guided by different signs. So you should proceed with the U-turn when the way is clear, yield to oncoming traffic, signal your turn, and complete the maneuver safely.

2. What does a Y-intersection sign indicate?

- A. Roundabout ahead

Recognizing warning signs that show road layout is the idea here. This sign uses a Y shape to represent a junction where the road splits into two branches (or two side roads join the main road) ahead. That tells you to slow a bit, watch for vehicles entering from the side roads, and be ready to choose your path safely as you approach the intersection. The other options don't fit the symbol: a roundabout ahead would show a circular pattern; a sign about decreasing speed would not depict a fork in the road; a No U-turn sign shows a U with a slash. So this sign specifically indicates a Y-shaped intersection ahead.

3. Which statement is true regarding a green signal?

Green signals tell you it's your turn to move. You may go straight or make a right turn after yielding to pedestrians and any cross traffic. A left turn on a standard green light isn't allowed because opposing traffic isn't required to stop for your left turn, so you'd need a dedicated left-turn signal or arrow to proceed safely. Always watch for pedestrians, cyclists, and any signs that change the allowed movements.

4. What does the road marking meaning 'speed limit' indicate?

The marking that means speed limit communicates the maximum legal speed for that stretch of road. When you see it, you should not drive faster than the limit shown, and you may need to slow down in adverse conditions or near hazards. This is different from markings that indicate where to stop, where pedestrians cross, or where you should follow a specific route, which guide actions like stopping, crossing, or turning rather than setting a speed. So the purpose of this marking is to control how fast vehicles may travel to keep traffic moving safely.

5. All motorcycles/mopeds are entitled to use of the entire lane.

Motorcycles have the right to use the full width of a traffic lane. This lets them ride in the center of the lane for better visibility and safer maneuvering around hazards. Drivers should not push a motorcycle to the edge or assume it will stay in a narrow strip; give space and pass only when safe. So this statement is true because motorcycles are entitled to the full lane just like other vehicles. The other options don't fit because there is a clear, general right for motorcycles to use the full lane, not a conditional or undefined rule.

6. Which of the following is true when dealing with a blind spot and changing lanes?

- A. Sound the horn to alert them.**
- B. Do not linger; check over your shoulder before changing lanes.**
- C. Change lanes regardless.**
- D. Slow down and stop.**

When changing lanes, the crucial step is to turn and look over your shoulder into the lane you want to enter. Mirrors don't show everything, and a vehicle can sit in a blind spot you can't see, so you shouldn't linger in that area or try to merge without a clear clearance. The move should be made only when there is a safe gap; using the horn won't reliably warn hidden drivers and isn't a substitute for checking the blind spots. Refrain from changing lanes regardless, and avoid slowing down and stopping in traffic—each of those can create unsafe situations. Instead, signal, check mirrors, perform the shoulder check, and merge when it's safe.

7. What is the proper use of turn signals?

- A. Signal only when turning left.
- B. Keep the signal on after you have completed the maneuver.

Turn signals are for clearly communicating your driving intentions to others. You should signal well before you turn or change lanes so that drivers, cyclists, and pedestrians have time to react. Keep the signal on while you complete the maneuver so your action stays visible, then cancel it after you've finished to prevent confusing other road users. Signaling only when turning left ignores other maneuvers you might perform, leaving the right and lane-change actions uncommunicated. Leaving the signal on after the maneuver can mislead others into thinking you plan to continue or repeat a move. Never canceling the signal creates ongoing confusion.

8. During a tire blowout, what is the correct sequence of actions after you gain control?

- A. Ease off the accelerator, then grip the wheel
- B. Immediately brake hard and pull over

When a tire blows out, the vehicle can pull toward the damaged tire and become hard to control, so the best approach is a calm, controlled sequence: grip the wheel firmly to keep the car from wandering, ease off the accelerator gradually to reduce speed without causing a sudden weight shift, and steer smoothly toward a safe location away from traffic so you can stop safely. Braking hard or abruptly can worsen loss of control, and steering in a way that doesn't guide you to a safe spot can leave you in danger or blocking lanes. This combination maintains control, reduces speed safely, and moves you to a safer area.

9. On USFK Korea roads, which side do you drive on, and how should you pass other vehicles?

- A. Left side of the road; pass on the right where allowed.
- B. The right side of the road; pass on the left in all circumstances.
- C. Either side is acceptable if traffic is light.
- D. The right side of the road; pass on the left where safe and legal.**

Driving on the right side and passing on the left where it's safe and legal is how traffic moves on USFK Korea roads. In right-hand-drive systems, the right lanes are for normal travel and the left lane is used for overtaking slower vehicles. You pass on the left to maintain visibility and avoid weaving around oncoming traffic, and you only do so when there's a clear, legal opportunity—meaning no solid lines, no “no passing” zones, plenty of visibility, and no hazards like curves or intersections ahead. After you've passed, return to the right and resume regular travel. This keeps traffic orderly and reduces the chance of collisions.

10. What is the purpose of the parking brake?

- A. To apply extra braking power while driving.**
- B. To shift the transmission into park while moving.**
- C. To hold the vehicle in place when parked, especially on hills.**

The main idea is that the parking brake is there to hold the car in place when you've stopped, especially on hills. It works independently of the regular foot brakes and usually acts on the rear brakes or through an electronic mechanism to keep the vehicle from rolling. When you're parked on an incline, engaging the parking brake adds a secure backup hold so the car won't move even if the transmission shifts or the regular brake isn't enough. It isn't meant to slow or stop the car while you're driving, and using it to brake at speed can cause loss of control or damage. You set it after you've come to a complete stop and then release it before you start moving again.
