Administrative reviews and judicial punishment, though important in their own contexts, do not capture the main intent of NJP, which is more about maintaining the integrity of the unit and the morale of its members. Exemplary conduct is a goal across the military but not specifically the focus of NJP proceedings.

The other options do not align with the prescribed conduct for soldiers when faced with capture, as they may suggest a more passive stance or acceptance that undermines the fighter ethos and resilience expected from military personnel.
