This structure helps convey a future possibility or event. The other options do not fit the grammatical structure required by the sentence. "Loose" refers to something not tight, "lost" is the past tense of lose and does not work here as the sentence is discussing a future event, and "loosen" means to make something less tight, which does not apply in the context of playing a game.

"Mine" is a possessive pronoun that does not fit grammatically in the sentence structure as it would require rephrasing. "Myself" is a reflexive pronoun and also does not fit here, as it doesn't suit the context of ownership between the speaker and their sister.
