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Explanations

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1. What is the focus of General Order 3?

The focus of General Order 3 is centered on the responsibility to report violations of orders that are being enforced. This is crucial because it emphasizes the importance of accountability and vigilance within the ranks. Allied defense tactics are strategic military operations that fall outside the personal and historical acknowledgment represented by the hymn.
