While a database stores structured data and can include references or links to web page content, it does not directly store the HTML or media files themselves. The file system pertains to how files are organized and stored on a physical disk, but in the context of web development, it is the server that actively manages and serves these files to users. Thus, the server is the component responsible for holding the web page and its associated media content for consumption.
