The full Qualified Domain Name (FQDN) or IP address will resolve the specific instance of the vCenter Server you are trying to manage, ensuring that your requests are accurately directed to the correct server. Using this approach helps to standardize access to the management interface across various environments. In contrast, URLs that lack encryption or refer to local addresses do not meet the best practices for accessing vCenter. An address with "http" would expose data to potential interception, while "localhost" links to the local machine and won't connect to a remote vCenter instance. Similarly, specifying the port 443 directly is

Mandatory guest operating systems do not inherently affect resource efficiency but rather determine compatibility and functionality on the virtualization layer. Physical server partitioning, while it allows for separation of resources, could lead to inefficiencies if the allocated resources do not match the workload requirements, unlike real-time workload balancing that actively adapts to changing conditions.
