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Explanations

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1. How long are legend drug prescriptions valid from the date issued in Washington?

- A. 6 months
- B. 1 year**
- C. 2 years
- D. Until the medication expires

In Washington, legend drug prescriptions are valid for 1 year from the date of issue. This means that the medication must be picked up within 1 year and any refills must also be used within that timeframe. The other options are incorrect because they do not align with the state's specific regulations regarding prescription validity. Option A of 6 months is too short, while option C of 2 years is too long. Option D is incorrect because while the expiration date of the medication may be a factor, it does not determine the validity of the prescription itself. A pharmacy owner is required to maintain records for a minimum of 2 years and pay an annual license fee to operate their business. 8. How long is emergency contraception approved for use after unprotected sex?

The other options are incorrect because - Option A (24 hours) is not enough time for the emergency contraception to be fully effective. - Option B (48 hours) is also not enough time and falls within the 72-hour timeframe. - Option D (120 hours) is too long and the effectiveness of the emergency contraception decreases significantly after 72 hours. Emergency contraception is most effective when taken within 72 hours, but it can still be effective up to 120 hours after unprotected sex.

9. Can prescription refill information be faxed between pharmacies?

- A. Yes, with pharmacist's approval and technician's assistance**
- B. No, it's not allowed
- C. Only if the original prescriber consents in writing
- D. Only within the same pharmacy chain

Prescription refill information can be faxed between pharmacies with the approval of a pharmacist and the assistance of a technician. An outsourcing facility is a type of compounding pharmacy that produces large quantities of compounded drugs. Compounding is the process of combining, mixing, or altering ingredients to create customized medications for patients. The FDA requires outsourcing facilities to submit a list of compounded drugs every 6 months to ensure compliance with safety and quality standards. This list should include the names and quantities of all compounded drugs produced during that time period. Options A and B are incorrect because they are not relevant to the reporting requirements of an outsourcing facility. Option D is incorrect because it is not the annual profit report that the FDA requires from outsourcing facilities, but rather a list of compounded drugs.
