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## **Explanations**

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## 1. What is the purpose of Zeta Phi Beta Incorporated?

*Zeta Phi Beta's purpose centers on a holistic set of guiding ideals that shape both its service to others and the character of its members. The organization aims to foster Service, Charity, Scholarship, Civil and Cultural Endeavors, Sisterly Love, and Finer Womanhood. This means more than just doing good deeds or hosting events; it encompasses helping the community, upholding academic excellence, engaging civically and culturally, strengthening bonds among sisters, and striving for refined, ethical conduct. The description that includes all six ideals—along with the emphasis on Sisterly Love and Finer Womanhood—best captures the full mission. The other options describe narrower activities, which don't reflect the complete purpose of Zeta Phi Beta.*

*Zeta women serve the community through a range of activities that reflect a broad commitment to service. Direct efforts through community service projects meet real, local needs with hands-on action. They also disseminate legislative information, helping people understand laws and civic processes so they can participate more effectively in advocacy and policy discussions. Additionally, contributing to organized charities strengthens networks and resources for those in need. Because service for Zeta Phi Beta spans hands-on action, civic education/advocacy, and philanthropy, the option that includes all of these approaches best captures how they provide service to the community.*

*Founding location matters for identifying a sorority's heritage. Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc. was founded at Butler University in Indianapolis, Indiana, in 1922. This distinguishes it from the others listed, which were founded at Howard University in Washington, D.C.: Alpha Kappa Alpha in 1908, Delta Sigma Theta in 1913, and Zeta Phi Beta in 1920. So the sorority founded at Butler is Sigma Gamma Rho.*

#### 4. When was the National Elder Care Program initiative instituted?

*Understanding this question hinges on recalling when the National Elder Care Program began. The year 2012 is the moment the initiative is shown to have been officially instituted in the course materials, marking its formal launch. This date is used in the exam to test your memory of the program's timeline. The other years don't align with the documented inception in the references, so they don't fit the established schedule. If you want to verify, check the program's founding documents or the study guide's timeline for the act or announcement that established it.*

#### 5. What four components comprise the Pearls concept used by ZPB?

*The Pearls concept in Zeta Phi Beta centers on four guiding attributes: Scholarship, Service, Sisterly Love, and Finer Womanhood. These four pillars define the standards members strive to live by every day. Scholarship covers academic excellence, lifelong learning, and intellectual growth. Service focuses on giving back to the community and helping others through volunteer work and outreach. Sisterly Love emphasizes strong, supportive relationships among members and a commitment to uplifting one another. Finer Womanhood reflects refined character, integrity, ethical conduct, and gracious leadership in all aspects of life. Together, these four form the Pearls because they balance intellectual, social, ethical, and communal dimensions of membership, guiding actions, programs, and personal development within the sorority. Other terms like Leadership or Empowerment appear in broader discussions of growth and impact, but they are not the four components that comprise the Pearls; the traditional Pearls emphasize these four specific areas.*

*The Divine Nine are the nine historically Black fraternities and sororities that belong to the National Pan-Hellenic Council (NPHC). These organizations together form the recognized group known as the Divine Nine, reflecting their shared history and collaborative efforts in promoting service, scholarship, and sisterhood/brotherhood. The full lineup includes Alpha Phi Alpha, Alpha Kappa Alpha, Kappa Alpha Psi, Omega Psi Phi, Delta Sigma Theta, Phi Beta Sigma, Zeta Phi Beta, Sigma Gamma Rho, and Iota Phi Theta. Any option that omits one or more of these groups isn't the complete set, which is why the full list is the best answer.*

## 7. How does Zeta Phi Beta relate to other NPHC member organizations?

- A. It collaborates on shared goals of service, education, and empowerment through the NPHC umbrella.

*Working with other NPHC member organizations is how Zeta Phi Beta advances its mission. As part of the National Pan-Hellenic Council, ZPB collaborates with sister organizations to pursue shared goals of service, education, and empowerment under the NPHC umbrella. This means joint service projects, scholarships, leadership development, and public service campaigns that benefit communities beyond individual chapters. The idea that Zeta Phi Beta operates independently without collaboration doesn't fit how the council is structured, since membership emphasizes unity and coordinated effort. It isn't about internal competitions for resources or focusing only on chapter activities, because nationwide programs and partnerships with other member organizations are central to how the group operates.*

## 8. Which achievement followed the charting of the first Amicae chapter?

*The key idea is how Zeta Phi Beta expands its reach through auxiliary structures. Amicae is the auxiliary group created to involve women who aren't eligible for membership but who still support the sorority's mission. When the first Amicae chapter is chartered, the immediate accomplishment is formally organizing that auxiliary group within the sorority's framework. This sets up a structured way for supporters to participate in service and sisterhood alongside the collegiate chapters. The other options refer to different kinds of growth or activities (establishing collegiate chapters, scholarships, or a national Boule) and aren't the direct consequence of charting the first Amicae chapter.*

## 9. What is the role of the National Tamias?

*Tamias refers to the treasurer in Zeta Phi Beta, so the National Tamias is the national financial officer. This role focuses on the sorority's money: collecting national dues, maintaining ledgers and financial records, managing accounts, and preparing budgets and financial reports for the National Council. The Tamias also coordinates with committees on funding for programs, ensures compliance with financial policies, and oversees audits and financial controls, keeping the sorority financially accountable and transparent. This stands apart from the National Secretary, who handles records and correspondence; the National Parliamentarian, who safeguards procedural rules; and the National President, who leads the organization.*

*Founding locations of major Greek-letter organizations. Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc. was established at Butler University in Indianapolis, Indiana, in 1922 by six women focused on education and service. The other groups began at different campuses: Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. and Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. were founded at Howard University in Washington, D.C., and Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. was founded at Indiana University Bloomington. So, the organization established at Butler University is Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc.*
